

EPA Student Employment Opportunities

Here is some information about summer programs offered by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in Washington, DC. This may be a great opportunity for those of you who may have family or friends in the DC area who you can stay with for the summer.

Student Career Experience Program (SCEP) and Student Temporary Employment Program (STEP)

For students seeking employment opportunities, these are the two most often used programs for hiring students

1. Student Temporary Employment Program - High school and college students may be hired for the summer or at any time.
2. Student Career Experience Program - Students may gain valuable work experience directly related to their fields of study while participating in this program.

These programs offer career-related employment that will enrich your academic experience through valuable work experience. To qualify, you must be at least 16 years old and enrolled as a degree-seeking student. More specifically, you must be taking at least a half-time academic or vocational and technical course load at one of the following:

- accredited high school
- technical or vocational school, or
- a two- or four-year accredited college or university at the undergraduate, graduate, or professional school level.
