Boys' State Program in Citizenship for High School Students (American Legion)

In cooperation with the American Legion, the University sponsors North Carolina Boys' State, a program to provide training in American government and citizenship.

Approximately 450 boys attend the program, which is scheduled for June 5-13. Applicants must have given evidence of leadership in high school. Participants have all expenses paid and are selected by the American Legion in conjunction with local high school officials.
