

***2005 Summer League Game 1 Recap, Chiefs vs. Unknowns,  
6/20/05, 9:30 p.m., Cabin John Ice Rink***

The following is a transcript of last night's Washington Chiefs' wrap-up show.....

(Cue splashy music and cut in play-by-play footage).....

Oh no..... the call is against the Chiefs! And they have no goalie! Chiefs now touch it up, and the whistle blows.

Kobernick is being hauled off for a 2 minute tripping minor, and the Chiefs are livid! What an unfortunate call.....

*sniper Josh Schopf, shifty Jeff Chan, speedster Ryan Fayhee, and playmaker Rob Fobian.*

*On defense, leader Brian Crosson, scrappy Curtis McCormick, hard charging Robert Dewey, towering Jerry Tollander, and punisher Dave Leib, will be joined by the always crafty, Susan "bug" Wood. Bug begins her first campaign on the backline bringing her extraordinary passing and backward skating skills with a healthy dose of hard hitting. Opposing wingers, you have been warned!*

*Last but not least, in what may prove to be the shrewdest personnel move since the Los Angeles Kings stole Wayne Gretzky from the Edmonton Oilers, veteran, whilst and at the same time, rookie goaltender Brian Meeks will pull on the pads for the Chiefs this summer and hopefully, beyond. Newly named Chiefs Director of Player Personnel and Recruiting, Beth Dewey works with Brian and although terms of the deal were not disclosed, evidently an Esskay Weiner endorsement as part of Brian's pre-game meal and permission to continue playing shortstop with the Washington Marshians softball team (but only if he can play doubleheaders before Chiefs games!) were part of the deal. Brian played a considerable amount of hockey growing up, although he has been on a 25 year sabbatical. Armed with athleticism and a hot glove hand, not to mention an equipment bag made by the goalie equipment company bearing his name, Brian will also bring a bit of much needed levity and respect for the game and his teammates, which had been sorely lacking in the goaltending department previously. And with only 16 players on the paid roster, look for HNA to assign a mystery player to the Chiefs in the near future!*

Brian Meeks had a very strong game in goal tonight, despite giving up 4 goals. We don't have the final totals but I score it 82 saves on 86 shots for a 95% save percentage. Also having a great game tonight was Ryan Fayhee, whose skating is really coming on*

*strong as he flew up and down the ice, providing both a forechecking and backchecking presence.*

*Tonight's Number 1 Star of the Game was awarded to Josh Schopf with stars 2 and 3 going to Brian Meeks and Ryan Fayhee. Tonight's "Hit of the Night" brought to you by Chico's Bail Bonds was delivered by Joel "Mountain" Wood as he brought a ton of bricks down on Unknowns' winger "Down Under" Price. Tonight's injury report, brought to you by Providence Hospital, finds Ira Rabin questionable after his head glanced off the goal post in a scrum for the puck, Rob Fobian also questionable and likely to be upgraded to probable with a bruised knee. Fans, remember, when you need to make bail, make it Chico's! And when you get injured, get to Providence Hospital, the friendliest Hospital in town!*

*Following tonight's game the team held their annual captaincy voting which resulted in no changes as the team strongly supported Crosson's reelection. Also, several post-season awards were handed out: Josh Schopf and Ira Rabin (the team's most improved player) received Jeremy Roenick equipment checklists so that they would not forget their equipment in the future. JoLinda Johnson, received a floral hammer to use on the opposition. Finally, Dave Leib received a tiara and matching earrings in recognition of his "Miss Congeniality" award. A second set was also awarded so that Leib twins, Maya and Chloe, could share in Dad's prestigious award!*
