

2009 Annual Meeting Minutes

The Town of Holland Annual Meeting was held on Thursday April 6, 2009 at 8 pm. Chairman Jerome Wall called the meeting to order, the Pledge of Allegiance was recited and proceedings started.

The minutes of the last Annual Meeting were read, there were no corrections and a motion to approve was made by Doug Verbaten and a 2nd was given by Chris Biese.

The next item to be discussed was the reading of the Annual Report. The only item of interest was the cost of Feral Cats and their disposal. Sup. Geiger gave an explanation on how difficult it was to have a place to board them and also if a Vet has to be involved. After Sup. Geiger's explanation a motion to approve the report was made by Doug Vrbaten, 2nd by Butch Jeske, Motion Passed.

There being no old business the chairman asked if there was any new business.

Chris Beise stated he was opposed to Deyo Disposal receiving the bid for garbage and recycling pick up. He further stated the referendum was confusing and people didn't understand the wording. He also stated his contractor picks up recycling every week and that to him was a plus. A Mr. Hoffman stated that when Mr. Biese came around with the petition he misstated things and he didn't think that was right. Mr. Deyo was asked if he could pick up recyclables every week and replied yes. When asked how much; he said it would be 2.15 per week or double what he had for 26 weeks. There was much discussion on how the price of recyclables has dropped and when it would recover. Mr. Haen asked if the Hollandtown Park could be added to Mr. Deyo's route at no charge. Mr. Deyo said it could. Cletus Hubers made a motion to have the Town Board act on the contract at their May meeting Doug Verbaten gave a 2nd. Motion Passed.

The Chairman asked that the Board be given authority to, in an emergency, borrow \$20,000 if needed. A motion to give that authority was made by Doug Verbaten, 2nd by Chris Biese. Motion passed.

The Chairman stated that we have enough money in the Bridge Fund and that portion that the Town would levy would be used for roads.

The gravel bids came in at \$5.90 and Scott Const. Had the low bid of \$42,800.00.

The public asked when Hwy. D and KK would be done. The Chairman stated that Hwy. D from Brooks Oil to Wrightstown would be this summer as well as that portion of KK from Calumet to Hwy D.

There being no other business a motion to adjourn was made by Doug Verbaten, 2nd by Chris Biese.
