

April 2009 Minutes

The Town Board of Holland met the 6th of April 2009 at 8pm.

Chairman Wall called the meeting to order and all members were present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and the minutes of the last meeting were read. A motion was made by Sup. Tom VandeWetteing to approve and was seconded by Sup. Geiger. The Chairman asked if there was any old business, there being none, Asked Attorney Sickel if he would explain the addition to the Constable Ordinance. Mr. Sickel explained that the addition would give the Constable authority to access the Department of Transportation (DOT) database to give him access to the names of owners of vehicles which were left abandoned or were in violation of town ordinance. After Attorney Sickel's explanation, a motion to approve the addition to the ordinance was made by Sup. Geiger, second was made by Sup. VandeWettering, motion passed. Attorney Sickel stated it should be posted in three places and an affidavit by the Clerk stating is was done.

The next item to be discussed was the bid by Deyo Disposal. They explained their service, repair and customer service. The board requested an accurate count on the number of households serviced. Sup. VandeWettering motioned to table this item for one month in order to iron out all the details, motion was seconded by Sup. Geiger, motion to table for one month passed.

Attorney Sikel explained the new lease agreement with the Askeaton Softball Club. The club would have exclusive use of the Skeater Dome and when not in use, the town residents would have access to it. The lease outlined the perimeters and the responsibilities of the Askeaton Softball Club. It was understood that all parks were to be treated equally. Doug Verbeten asked if the Askeaton Softball Club could have fundraisers for other entities, such as high school sports, and it was stated yes. It was also stated that if any vandalism occurred, it would be the responsibility of the Askeaton Softball Club to fix it. A motion was made by Sup. Geiger to accept the Draft Lease, it was seconded by Sup. VandeWettering, motion passed.

The bills were presented and after examination, a motion was made to pay them was made by Sup. VandeWettering and seconded by Sup. Geiger. Motion passed.

Being no other business, a motion to adjourn was made by Sup. Vandewettering, seconded by Sup. Geiger, meeting adjourned.
