Honey & Wax Show

General Rules

- Honey and wax must be West Virginia honey and wax or, if the beekeeper is from a surrounding state, he/she must belong to a West Virginia beekeepers association.
- All entries become the property of the West Virginia Honey Festival for its use in promotion of the Festival, which may include auction at the event.
- Only one entry in each class may be made by an individual, or that individual's family, or that individual's apiary. All entries must be the product of the entrant's apiary and have been produced since the previous West Virginia Honey Festival Honey & Wax Show.
- Identifying labels on the entries are not permitted.
- Exhibitor must choose which classes to place entries in. Judges may adjust entries at their discretion.
- Entries can only be made during the hours published.
- Entries must be left intact and on display until released by the Show Chairman.
- No commercial products or displays are permitted.
- Entries must have been produced and submitted by the exhibitor.
- The decision of the judges in all cases will be final.
- The West Virginia Honey Festival assumes no responsibility for loss or damage of entries. Although the WVHF will exercise all due care in judging and displaying entries, exhibitors enter items at their own risk.
- Entries in classes H1, H2, H3, H4, and H5 must be in queen line or classic jars and may have plain metal or plastic lids. Entries in classes H6, H7, and H8 must be in the appropriate container: window cartons, round section lids - both transparent, cut-comb box - all sides transparent. Entries in class H9 must be displayed in bee-proof cases having both sides made of transparent glass or plastic.
