| 0.5 oz     | Sun Sugar         | 62               | I          | F, T                   | Orange fruit with “tropical”, sweet taste   |
| 0.5-1 oz   | Super Sweet 100   | 65               | I          | V,F                    | Super sweet cherry tom., extra high in Vit.C  |
| 0.7-1 oz   | Yellow Pear (HL)  | 70               | I          |                        | Yellow, pear shaped; distinctive salad tomato   |
| 1 oz       | Tommy Toe (HL)    | 70               | I          |                        | Vigorous plant; outstanding flavor  |
| 0.6 oz     | Husky Cherry Red  | 65               | ISI        |                        | Sweet taste; good for containers  |
| 3-4 oz     | Green Zebra (HL)  | 72               | I          |                        | Delicious in salads. Ripens w.a yellow blush  |
| 1-2 oz     | Principe Borghese | 75               | D          |                        | Italian variety. Plum-shaped, meaty & little juice. Favorite for drying                 |
| 3-4 oz     | Roma VF           | 75               | D          | V, F, A                | Pear-shaped meaty fruits for pastes, sauces   |
| 5-7 oz     | First Lady II     | 65               | I          | V, F, A, N, T, St      | Early, tasty & crack resistant fruits. Early Girl replacement                           |
| 5-7 oz     | Husky Red         | 67               | ISI        | V, F, A                | Patio tomato with continuous production   |
| 5-8 oz     | Wisconsin 55 (HL) | 75               | ISI        | ST, early blight       | Ripens evenly, crack-resistant. Popular variety for canning.                            |
| 6-7 oz     | Lemon Boy         | 72               | I          | V, F, N, A, St         | Lemon-yellow, mild flavored fruits; high yields   |
| 6-8 oz     | Jet Star          | 70               | I          | V, F                   | Excellent flavor, low acidity. Ripen uniformly<br>Very productive<br>Nice compact habit |
| 8 oz       | Amish Paste (HL)  | 85               | I          |                        | Excellent Flavor, low acidity. Best for sauces & canning                                |
| 8 oz       | Bush Celebrity    | 67               | D          | V, F1, F2, N, T, A, St | The same ‘Celebrity’ as a more compact plant  |

| 12 oz    | Park's Whopper       | 65    | I | V, F, N,<br>T                | Good eating; crack resistant                       |
| 16-24 oz | Brandywine (HL)      | 80-85 | I |                              | Popular heirloom; best-flavored tomato!            |
| 12-16 oz | Pruden's Purple (HL) | 70    | I |                              | An early Brandywine; delicious taste!              |

**I = Indeterminate (staking) plants continue growing and setting fruit all season.**

**D = Determinate (bush or cage) plants reach a certain height and stop setting fruit**

**ISI = Indeterminate Short Internode**

**HL = Heirloom (Open Pollinated varieties)**

**V = Verticillium wilt; F = Fusarium wilt;**

**N = Root-knot Nematodes; T = Tobacco Mosaic Virus;**

**A = Alternaria Stem Canker; St = Stemphylium Gray Leaf Spot;**
