SPECIAL FESTIVAL EDITION

The Hull Real & Cider Festival 2009 will take place in Hull College's Horncastle Building, Charlotte Street, Kingston upon Hull, from Thursday 16th to Saturday 18th April 2009.

This is the second year that the festival has been held at this modern venue. It is situated just to the west of North Bridge, opposite Napoleon's Casino on George Street. It is only a 15-minute steady walk from the Hull Transport Interchange.

The opening hours will be 12 noon - 11pm on the Thursday and Friday, and will be 12 noon - sellout (or 11pm) on the Saturday. What are the chances of selling out early on the Saturday? Well, based on previous experiences we believe that we have over-ordered rather than under-ordered. Attendances on the Thursday and Friday would have to be exceptional for us not to be open until 11pm on the Saturday night.

There will be an admission charge of £3 after 5.00 pm on the Thursday and Friday. However, if you bring your partner or a friend, you will be able to take advantage of

the '2 for £5' offer. It will be free at all other times, and at all times to card-carrying CAMRA members. There will be no admission allowed after 10pm.

Real ale choice will consist of 80 different ales, brewed by mainly British independent breweries. Styles will include milds, bitters, best bitters, golden ales, strong ales, porters, stouts, lagers and organic beers. Some of the Champion Beers of Britain 2008 will be available.

Real ale prices will range from £2.20 to £2.80 a pint, depending on strength.

A U-shaped bar will sell 40 ales of a strength of up to 4.3% ABV by handpumps, and another bar will sell 40 ales of a strength of 4.4% and above by gravity, direct from the cask.

The Cider & Bottled Beer Bar will offer an interesting selection of 20 real ciders, 4 real perries, 10 Belgian bottled beers, 5 German bottled beers and 2 Czech bottled beers.

The Tombola with a pub and brewery-related theme will be one of the features of the festival again.

REAL ALE v SMOOTH

What is Real Ale?

Real ale is living beer. It continues to ferment and develop its full flavour in the cask.

Real Ale is brewed from traditional ingredients; malt, hops, water and yeast, matured by secondary fermentation in the container from which it is dispensed, and served without the extraneous use of carbon dioxide or nitrogen via hand-pumps.

Real Ale is also called cask beer or cask conditioned beer.

What are 'Smooth' beers?

Smooth beers are brewed in much the same way as real ale but eventually the natural yeast is killed and processed to give longer shelf-life. The dead beer is then resurrected by means of chemicals and served chilled through electric fonts. Smooth beers are also known as nitro-keg beers.

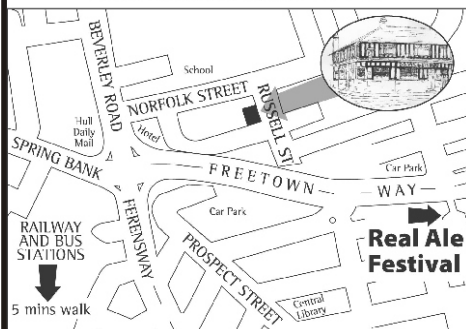

HULL PUB OF THE YEAR 2008

WELLINGTON INN KINGSTON UPON HULL

The Wellington Inn was voted 'Kingston upon Hull Pub of the Year 2008' by members of CAMRA, the Campaign for Real Ale, Hull & East Yorkshire Branch.

CAMRA members voted after carefully considering the following criteria: Community Focus, Atmosphere, Campaigning, Quality of Beer, Style/Decor, Service and Welcome and Value for Money. For the pub to be eligible for the competition the licensee had to be present since the 1st January 2008.

The Wellington Inn is situated on Russell Street and is owned and run by Richard & Janette Gant. This is the fourth Year in succession that they have won the competition, having being a joint winner of the 2005 and 2007 competition and winning the 2006 and 2008 competition outright.

It is described in the new 2009 CAMRA Good Beer Guide as: "Hidden free house gem just off Freetown Way, this former Hull Brewery pub dates from 1861 and serves up to six guest micro beers. It features a walk-in cooler stocking over 100 European bottled beers, note the impressive glass-fronted display in the back bar. Farmhouse ciders and perries can also be found, plus specialist European beers on draught and Lindisfarne fruit wines."

Branch Chairman, Alan Canvess, presented Richard & Janette with a framed certificate on the evening of Saturday 17th January at 10.00 pm.

Walters on Scale Lane, leased and run by Alan Murphy and Chrissy Fleming, was runner up in the 2008 competition. They were presented with a framed certificate on Wednesday 7th January.

It is described in the new 2009 CAMRA

Good Beer Guide as: "Contemporary bar, recently established as a free house by the former licensee of the nearby Old Black Boy and operating an over 21's door policy. Up to eight regularly changing guest beers are available, plus Belgian and German draught and bottled beers, fruit beers and Lindisfarne fruit wines.

The George Hotel in the Land Of Green Ginger (a finalist in the 2007 competition), the **Three John Scotts** in Lowgate, and **The Whalebone** in Wincolmllee were the other finalists in the 2008 competition.

CTC AWARD 2008

Dean Kirk and Paul Crosskill, licensees of the George Hotel, Land Of Green Ginger, Kingston upon Hull Beverley, have received a 'Committed To Cask Award 2008' in recognition of their "Continuing Commitment to Quality RealAle".

The 'Committed To Cask Awards' recognise those **licensees** in the Hull and East Yorkshire area that have demonstrated a "Continuing Commitment to Quality Real Ale" at a time when they are under great pressure to remove distinctive, tasty real ale and replace it with 'easily kept' heavily advertised, bland tasting nitro-keg beers. The awards are for the licensee's personal commitment and are not a pub award as such. They also acknowledge the specialised art of cellermanship. This is because real ale requires expertise to prepare and maintain it in good condition whereas nitro-keg beer only requires connecting to a mixed-gas cylinder before selling.

The regular real ales that are available in the George Hotel are Adnams Broadside, Fullers London Pride, Hopback Summer Lightning and St Austell Tribute. A changing guest beer is also available.

The pub's opening hours are 12-11 Sun-Thur and 12-12 Fri & Sat.

EY TOWN PUB OF THE YEAR 2008

DOG & DUCK BEVERLEY

The Dog & Duck Inn in Beverley was voted 'East Yorkshire Town Pub of the Year 2008' by members of CAMR, the Campaign for Real Ale, Hull & East Yorkshire Branch.

Members voted for their 'East Yorkshire Town Pub of the Year 2008' after carefully considering the following criteria: Community Focus, Atmosphere, Campaigning, Quality of Beer, Style/Decor, Service and Welcome, and Value for Money. For the pub to be eligible for the competition the licensee had to be present since the 1st January 2008.

The Dog & Duck Inn (a finalist in the 2007 competition), on Dog & Duck Lane in Beverley, is owned by Enterprise Inns and is run by tenant, Mark McMullen. The McMullen family have run the Dog & Duck since 1972 when Mark's father, David, became the licensee. They are now joint licensees with Mark managing the pub, ordering the beer, and looking after the cellar. The pub is a regular entrant in CAMRA's Good Beer Guide and Mark remembers the first cask guest beer that was sold in the pub around 1990 Theakston's XB and that was followed by Greene King Abbot.

Black Sheep Best Bitter, Caledonian Deuchars IPA and Copper Dragon Best Bitter are the regular beers available at the pub now. Guest beers are sourced locally, within a radius of some 50 miles around Beverley, through SIBA, the Society of Independent Brewers. Real ales from Cropton, Great Newsome, Wold Top and York breweries have featured recently.

Mark considers the presence of well-kept cask beers served at the right temperature (ie not chilled like lager) to be central to the appeal of the pub. Mark said "Cask beer is a point of conversation at the bar and keeping

the beer in good condition gives me job satisfaction".

The **Green Dragon in Beverley** and the **Bell Hotel in Drifffield** were the Joint Runners-up in the 2008 competition. The Green Dragon (winner of the 2007 competition) is owned by Mitchells & Butlers and is managed by Glyn & Alan Clarke. The Bell Hotel in Drifffield (runner-up in the 2007 competition) is owned and run by George and Rita Riggs

Branch Chairman, Alan Canvess, presented framed certificates to the winner and the joint runners-up on the evening of Saturday 10th January, during a specially organised CAMRA presentation trip.

The **Mariners Arms in Driffield** (a finalist in the 2007 competition) and the **Tiger Inn in Drifffield** were the other finalists in the 2008 competition.

CTC AWARD 2008

Bill & Lou Cowen, tenants of the Tiger Inn, Market Place, Drifffield, have received a 'Committed To Cask Award 2008' in recognition of there "Continuing Commitment to Quality Real Ale".

The 'Committed To Cask Awards' recognise those licensees in the Hull and East Yorkshire area that have demonstrated a "Continuing Commitment to Quality Real Ale" at a time when they are under great pressure to remove distinctive, tasty real ale and replace it with 'easily kept' heavily advertised, bland tasting nitro-keg beers. The awards are for the licensee's personal commitment and are not a pub award as such.

John Smith's Bitter and Black Sheep Bitter are the regular real ales that are available in the Tiger Inn. Four or five guest beers are also available.

A beer festival is held annually on the bank holiday weekend at the end of May

The pub's opening hours are 10.30-12 Mon-Sat and 11.30-10.30 Sun.

EY VILLAGE PUB OF THE YEAR 2008

PLOUGH INN HOLLYM

The Plough Inn in Hollym was voted 'East Yorkshire Village Pub of the Year 2008' by members of CAMRA, the Campaign for Real Ale, Hull & East Yorkshire Branch.

Members voted for their 'East Yorkshire Village Pubs of the Year 2008' after carefully considering the following criteria: Community Focus, Atmosphere, Campaigning, Quality of Beer, Style/Decor, Service and Welcome, and Value for Money. For the pub to be eligible for the competition the licensee had to be present since the 1st January 2008.

The Plough Inn (joint runner-up in the 2007 competition) is owned by a family partnership of Steve and Sue Martine and their daughter and her husband, Rachelle and Darren Maynard. The family purchased the pub in July 2005 after moving north from London. Steve was previously a teacher; Sue was a Learning Support Assistant; Darren was a HGV Driver in Australia; and Rachelle was an agronomist in Australia. Steve & Sue had gained valuable experience by working as voluntarily bar managers at their local cricket club (Stanford le Hope, Essex) for 4 years.

Tetley Bitter and two changing guest beers are available at the pub. Steve & Darren do most of the cellar work and have both attended a BII training course in Cellar Management. They hold an annual mini beer festival during the summer and it always proves to be popular.

When they took over the pub they could have just concentrated on heavily advertised, easily-kept products but they didn't and now the locals and visitors alike are enjoying an interesting and changing selection of guest beers, kept in excellent condition and served

in lined glasses, ensuring that you get a full pint.

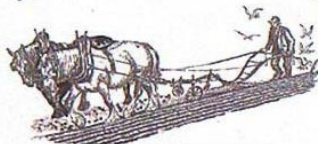

WHALEBONE KINGSTON UPON HULL

The Whalebone in Kingston upon Hull was named 'Hull & East Yorkshire Cider Pub Of The Year 2008' by CAMRA, the Campaign for Real Ale, Hull & East Yorkshire Branch.

The Whalebone is situated on Wincolmlee and is owned and run by Alex & Tina Craig. They have always supported real cider and provide two distinctively different tasting ciders for their discerning drinkers Weston's Old Rosie (ABV 7.3%) and Broadoak Kingston Black (ABV 8.4%). They also offer Weston's Country Perry (ABV 4.5%), which they introduced in September 2008.

This is the second year in a row that the Whalebone has won the competition. **The Wellington Inn** in Russell Street in Hull was runner-up and the **Hop & Vine** in Albion Street in Hull was third.

The three pubs were nominated by local members and were then visited by a panel of judges who made their decision after carefully considering the Quality, Temperature and Price of the ciders and perries available. Also considered were aspects of the pub itself: Service & Welcome, Community Focus, Atmosphere, Campaigning and Style/Décor.

David Litten, CAMRA's Hull & East Yorkshire Branch Apple Representative said, "The Whalebone offers a winning combination of quality, choice and the perfect temperature in a traditional pub atmosphere."

Alan Canvess, CAMRA's Hull & East Yorkshire Branch Chairman said, "The Whalebone actively promotes the sale of its two real ciders by selling them on prominently positioned handpumps, and at very reasonable prices."
