

## Matchbook Candy Holder (for Ghirardelli Chocolates)

Supplies:  
Cardstock  
Stapler  
Paper Cutter  
Decoration for the front



Cut cardstock 6" x 2 1/2"  
Score at 2 1/4", 2 7/8" & 5"

Decorate the front, attach the candy with a  
staple and close.

If you use other candy that's thicker –  
you might need to cut the cardstock a bit  
longer – Maybe 6 1/2 inches.

You could make  
These small enough  
To hold 1 lifesaver.



## Peppermint Patty Ornaments

### Supplies

Cardstock

Double sided tape

1/8" ribbon

Scissors

Punches

Peppermint Patties

Punch 2 scalloped circles

1 – 1 3/8" circle

1 – 1 1/4" circle with design

Cut a 4" piece of ribbon

Stick all pieces together with double sided tape





# Scallop Punch Turkey

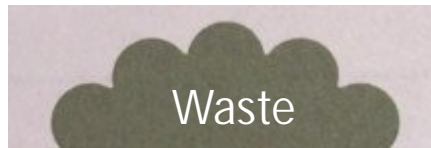


I used the following punches:  
the Scallop Circle,  
3/4" Circle,  
1/4" Circle,  
1-3/8" Circle,  
Boho Flower and  
3/4" Square.

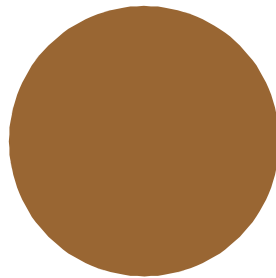
## Scallop Circle - Feathers



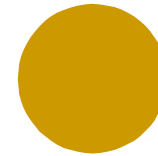
Punch 3 like from any paper.  
Cut off 5 scallops.



## 1 - 1 3/8" circle - Body



## 1 - 3/4" circle - Head



## 1 - 3/4" Square - cut into a Hat



## 2 - 1/4" Circles - Buttons



## 2 - Boho Blossoms - Feet



## 1 petal - for beak

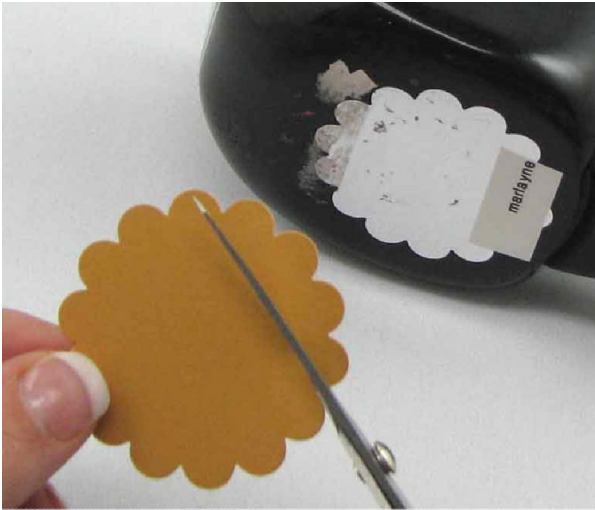


## 2 - 1/8" Circles - Eyes



Or you could just use a  
Black marker.

First, punch a scallop circle using your scallop circle punch and cut 5 scallops off the top. Do 3 like this of diff. colors.



Then open your scallop again and fold each side in. Just make three of these and tuck behind the circle punched out for the turkey's body.



Fold it in half - use your bone folder to get a good crease.

# The Nugget Holder



This holds 3 Nuggets sitting side by side & one on top.

## Supplies:

- Cardstock
- Ruler & paper cutter
- Corner Rounder (optional)
- 1/8 inch Ribbon or Raffia
- Double Sided Tape or adhesive
- Design on front and back
- 1/4 inch hole punch
- Hershey's Nuggets

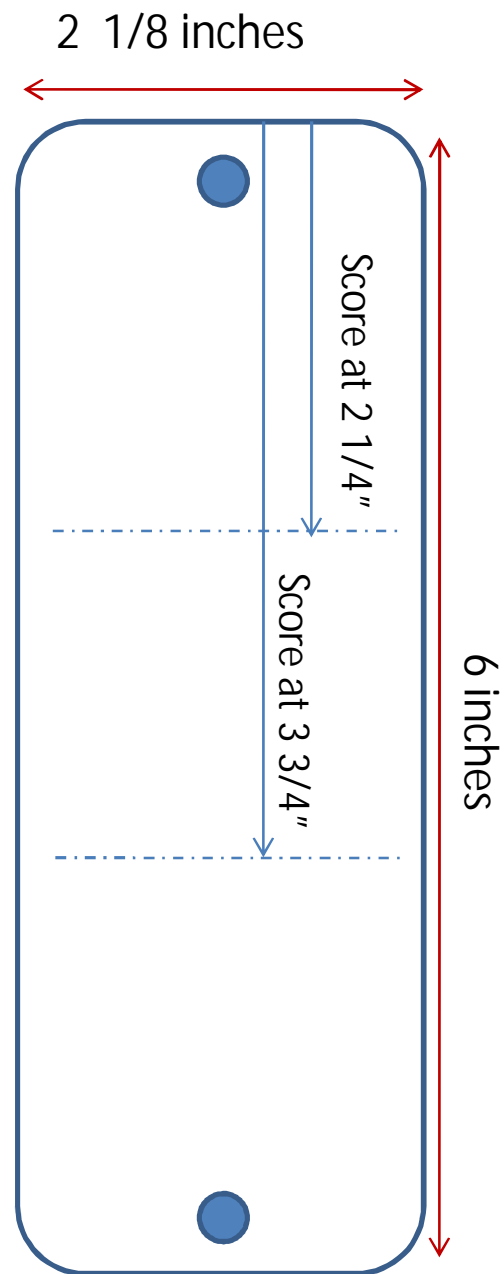


## Directions:

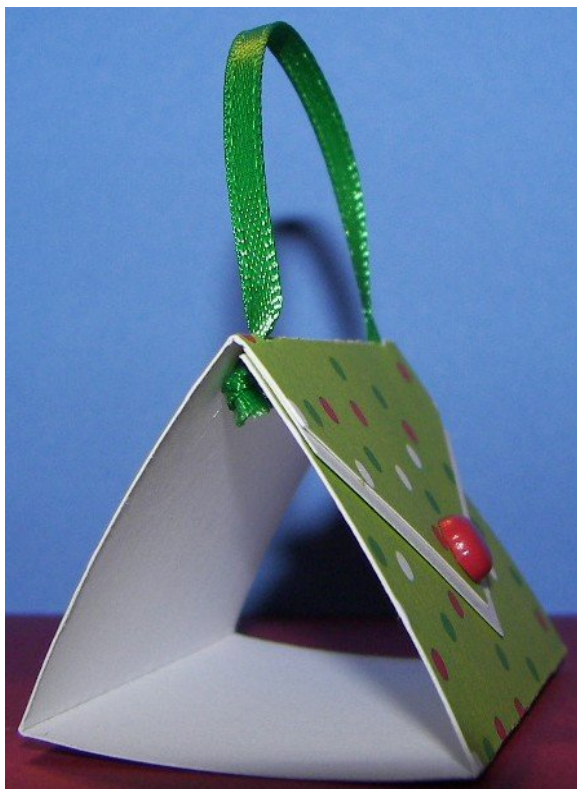
Cut paper to size, score 2 lines, & round corners.

Fold the 2 ends in on the score line.

Put tape or adhesive in the middle – place 2 pieces of candy side by side – put adhesive on the bottom of the 3<sup>rd</sup> piece and place on top. Thread ribbon or raffia through 2 holes and tie off.



# The Nuggget Purse



# The Nugget Purse

## Supplies:

Cardstock

Ruler & paper cutter

1/8 inch Ribbon

Double Sided Tape or other adhesive

1 brad or button or flower

1/8 inch hole punch

1 /16 inch hole punch

Hershey's Nuggets

This purse holds 2

Nuggets sitting side by side

Cut cardstock 5 1/4 inches by 2 1/8 inches. Score on the dotted lines : Measure in at 1 3/8 inches and score. Measure in at 2 3/4 inches and score and measure in at 4 1/8 inches and score.

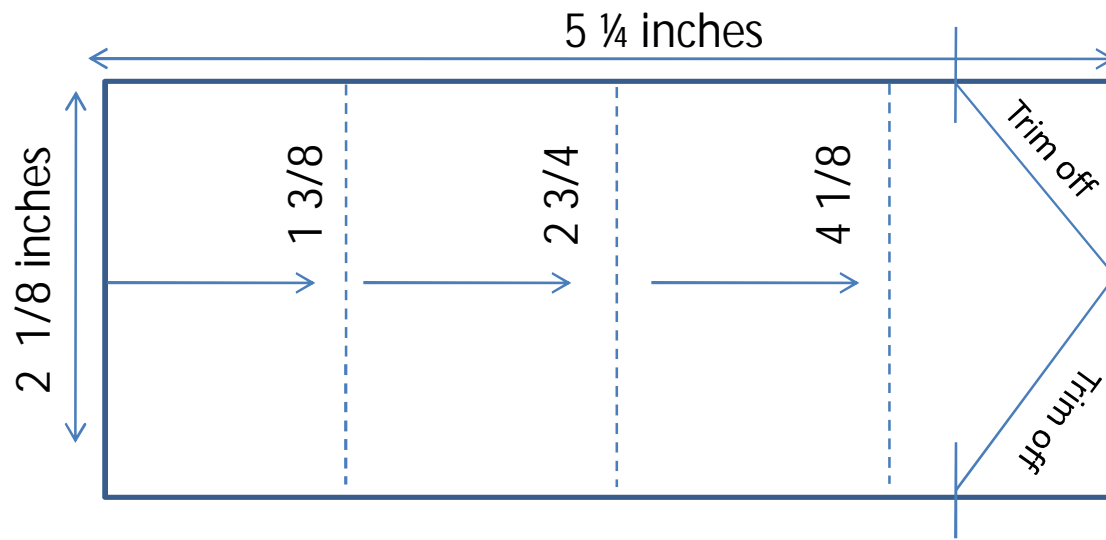
At the end section which is the flap – measure 1/4 inch from the last score line and then find the center and trim on each side of the center to create the pointed flap.

For the under-skirt of the flap - cut a piece of cardstock 2 1/8 inches by 1 1/2 inches.

Tape this piece under the flap and trim, leaving about 1/8 inch showing from underneath the flap - like the white under-skirt in the picture.

Punch 2 small 1/16 inch holes at the 4 1/8 inch score line and thread the ribbon through the holes and either knot or tape the ribbon to secure it. Punch a 1/8 inch hole through the flap and the front panel of the purse to stick the brad through. This holds the purse closed. You could use a button or sticker or flower in place of the brad. Then you just glue the flap to the front of the purse to keep it closed.

Put a little adhesive on the bottom of each nugget and slide them into the purse from either side.



Glue a contrasting piece of cardstock ( $2 \frac{1}{8}$  inches by  $1 \frac{1}{2}$  inches) under the flap and then trim – leaving about  $\frac{1}{8}$  inch of the contrasting cardstock showing under the flap.
