 Issue 1. William, b. c1793 from Culpeper death record. Married Sally Riley 15 Dec 1815.
 Issue 2. James, b. c1795. Married 1810-1820. Removed to Lynchburg area by 1824 from Fauquier.
 Issue 3. Unknown son. Probably named "John" or "Christopher".
 Issue 4. Hannah, b. c1798. Married James Burdett 2 Nov 1831.
 Issue 5. Henry ? Went south and never heard from. No further information.
 Issue 6. Unknown daughter. No further information.
 Issue 7. Jane, b. c1805. Married George Monroe 21 Dec 1829.
 Issue 8. Elizabeth, b. c1808. Married James Lear 5 Apr 1828.
 Issue 9. Robert, b. c 1812. Removed to Lynchburg area.
 Issue 10. Barnett/Bernard, b. c1815. Married Mary Holtzclaw 19 Nov 1837.
 Issue 11. Catherine, b. c1812. Married Benjamin Ball 10 Apr 1841.

John is double accounted in the 1830 census. Reason for this is unclear, but an important event apparently occurred to account for this. Despite age discrepancies, it is unmistakably the same individual. Bracketed data above is supporting census information of married children.

Placement, or birth order, of the children is approximated. The unknown son could easily be in position one (and likely is). Henry is estimated as issue 5, but also could be the first. If he is number 5, then he went south at a young age. The unknown daughter appears to have been born in the 1800 to 1804 period.

This analysis accounts for all known possible children of John Sutphin. Those born after 1800 would have been born in Fauquier County. Previous to this birth places could be Loudoun Co. VA, or possibly Fredrick Co. MD. John's place of birth was likely in Loudoun County.
