Our T-shirt this year is really COOL!

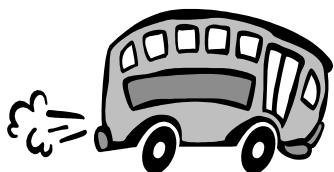

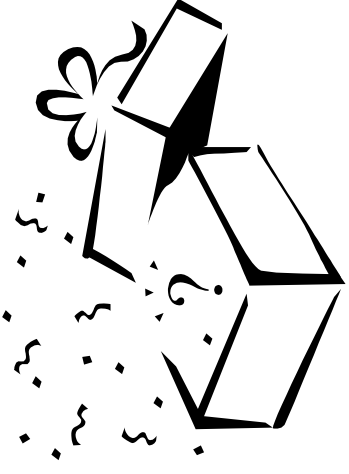

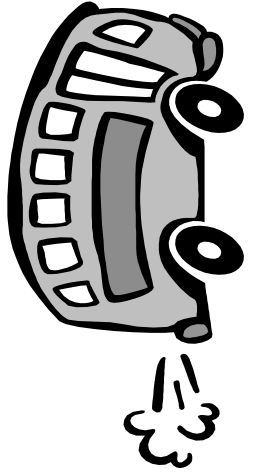
