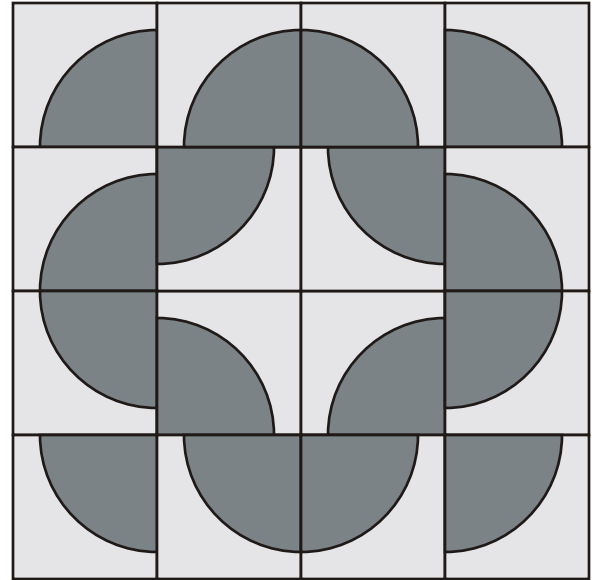


# “Love Ring”

A variation of the traditional Drunkard's Path block pattern. This one will finish to 16" square [16 ½" with seam allowance].

Using the applique method you can make 4 units at a time and eliminate stitching curved seams.

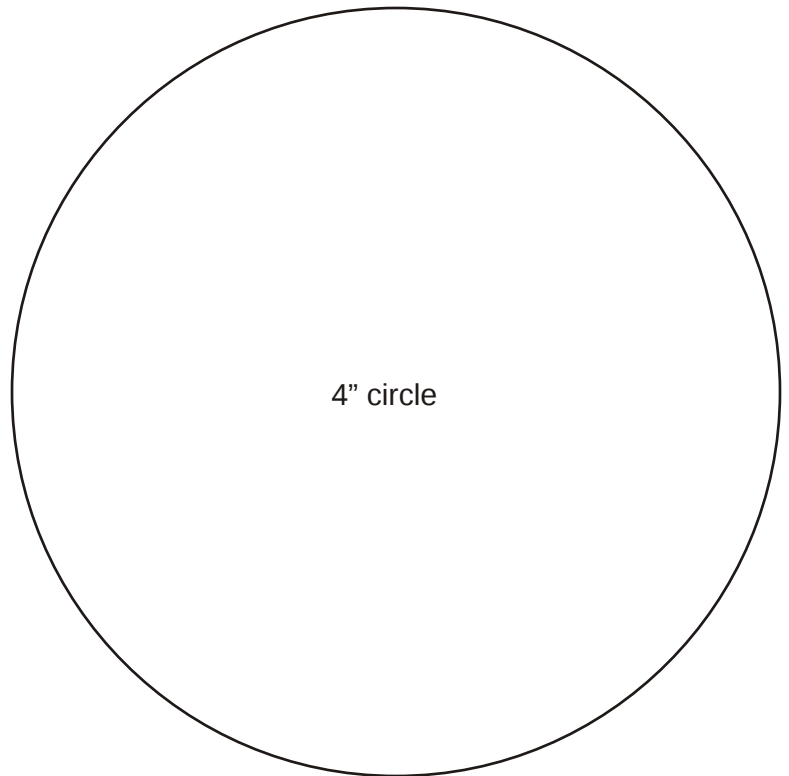


## Cutting Requirements:

- ~ Cut 4 - 9" squares of Background Fabric
- ~ Cut 4 - 5" squares of Main Fabric
- ~ Cut 4 - 5" squares of Lightweight Interfacing

## Method:

- 1> Trace the 4" circle onto the interfacing.
- 2> Layer the Main fabric squares with the interfacing squares and pin.
- 3> Using a small stitch length, stitch completely around the marked line.
- 4> Leaving a scant ¼" seam allowance, trim circles. Clip seam allowance.
- 5> Make a small slit in the interfacing and turn the circle through the slit. Gently push out the seam to form a nicely rounded circle.
- 6> Centre this circle onto the background square and machine applique in place.
- 7> Cut each finished backg round square, through the centres into 4 units 4 ½" square.
- 8> Arrange the 16 units just made, as shown in the block diagram and complete the block.

exactly 2" x 2"
