Brittany Scank was pleased with learning about the importance of appearance in the interview. Said Brittany, "I learned how you should come to an interview and how you should dress....and you should clean up before you come."

Joredan Churchill really enjoyed a geneticist who came as a guest speaker. She stated she learned..."if you take human genes and put them into animals they can grow (needed) body parts." The success of the program may allow its being repeated in the future.

Body Language and the Interview

Experts say communication between persons is more than 50 percent body language.

When one goes for that job they have hoped for their chances of getting a good job offer can be en-

hanced by maintaining good posture, making frequent eye contact, having a pleasant facial expression at appropriate times, projecting the voice loudly enough to be heard and speaking clearly at a re-

laxed normal pace.

If you slump, make nervous gestures, speak too softly or too loudly or mumble it can hurt you in the interview.

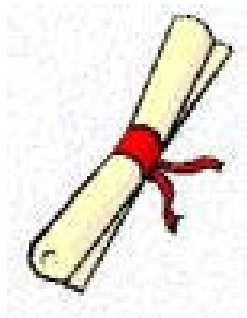

For several years WIETS has been involved in helping soon to be released inmates have a much better chance at obtaining employment when they are released. Staff, on a regular basis, conduct job readiness classes at the Putnamville as well as the Rockville Correc-

tional Facility.

At the Rockville facility the work is done in a joint effort with WORK ONE. This state employment service, co-located with WIETS, is pleased to cooperate in such an important venture. Both agencies understand that a re-

leased former inmate has a far greater chance of solid employment if they have received valuable job search skills while still incarcerated. The combined effort on the part of the state and WIETS has also taken place at the Federal Penitentiary in Terre Haute.
