He speaks frequently to nationwide audiences from a wide variety of fields on domestic violence and teen dating abuse awareness. Rev. Miles has been an ordained minister in the Church of God (Anderson, Indiana) since 1983.

His publications include: Ending Violence In Teen Dating Relationships: A Resource Guide For Parents And Pastors (Augsburg Books, 2005); Violence In Families: What Every Christian Needs To Know (Augsburg Books, 2002) and Domestic Violence: What Every Pastor Needs To Know (Fortress Press, 2000)
