

What To Bring?

- ❖ Please put nametags on each item that you do not want to lose.
- ❖ Please bring your Passport.
- ❖ Please do not bring any immodest clothing, such as baggy pants, crop-top shirts that show your midriff, or miniskirts.

Clothing

- 4-6 shirts
- 2 pairs pants and shorts (not too revealing; conservative)

Toiletries

Money

- Traveler's checks OK
- \$15 for airport usage tax on the way back to the United States
- \$25 for roundtrip fare on Airporter from Santa Rosa and Rohnert Park (Student ID)
- 2 gifts for the host families worth \$20 or more (think of the gift for the mother of the family, as she does all the cooking and we'll take care of you, etc.)

Miscellaneous

- Alarm clock
- Film and batteries (optional)
- Camera and video camera (optional)

Teacher's Survival Kit:

- Candy for rewards
- Flash cards
- Stickers (to reward children)
- Peanut butter or other food that you cannot live without.
