Standards of Behavior for Teachers

We are on duty all the time. Our behavior, language, etc. must reflect a good Christian attitude and show the best side of our American character.

In the classroom, you must be alert and interact with your students. No teacher will sleep or lie down during class time.

If you are ill, see the camp director to arrange for someone to take your class.

Do not leave your class unattended for more than 5 minutes. Call a Korean Teachers Assistant.

Our workday is long; there will be limited time for personal relaxation. We will have to help each other adjust to the demands of our schedules.

We will be living in quarters that allow little room for us to spread out, so keep your personal property neat and tidy.

Respect each other's property and privacy.

Curfew is 10:00 pm, unless you are on an official outing.

You will be required to assist with keeping our living quarters clean. There will be a daily cleaning schedule.

Communication with the Outside World

Letters: You will have to purchase stamps in Korea. Miyoung will usually have some that you can purchase from her. Letters can be mailed frequently.

Phones: There is limited phone use at the camp. Please plan to only be able to call home on the weekends. The payphone/phone card system will be explained. Or you may want to arrange for an international calling card before you leave the US.

E-mail: Weather permitting, we will arrange for everyone to visit a PC room for emailing at least once a week.

Clothing and Other Essentials

It is winter, be prepared with warm clothing. The indoors are heated by hot water pipes under the flooring.

Bring enough clothes for one week.

In addition to the obvious (pants, shirts, socks, underwear, sweaters, pajamas, personal cleanliness supplies), the following is a list of things you really should consider bringing to ensure your comfort:

Shower shoes

Indoor slippers

Heavy coat, hat, gloves, scarf

Boots (snow) that are easily removed

Laundry soap (there is one washing machine, be prepared to wash personal items by hand)

Flash light

Hangars

Air freshener or scented candles

Foot odor spray/powder

Vitamins

Medicines:

Tylenol/Advil/Aleve

Allergy or Cold medicine

Stomach/Diarrhea/Constipation medicine

Throat lozenges

Lip balm

Teaching Supplies

Rewards for students: stickers, bookmarks, candy, trading cards... use your imagination

Games: card games, board games, word games

Flash cards

Colored pencils, pens, markers, crayons

Old magazines with lots of pictures

Glue stick (or 2 or 3)
