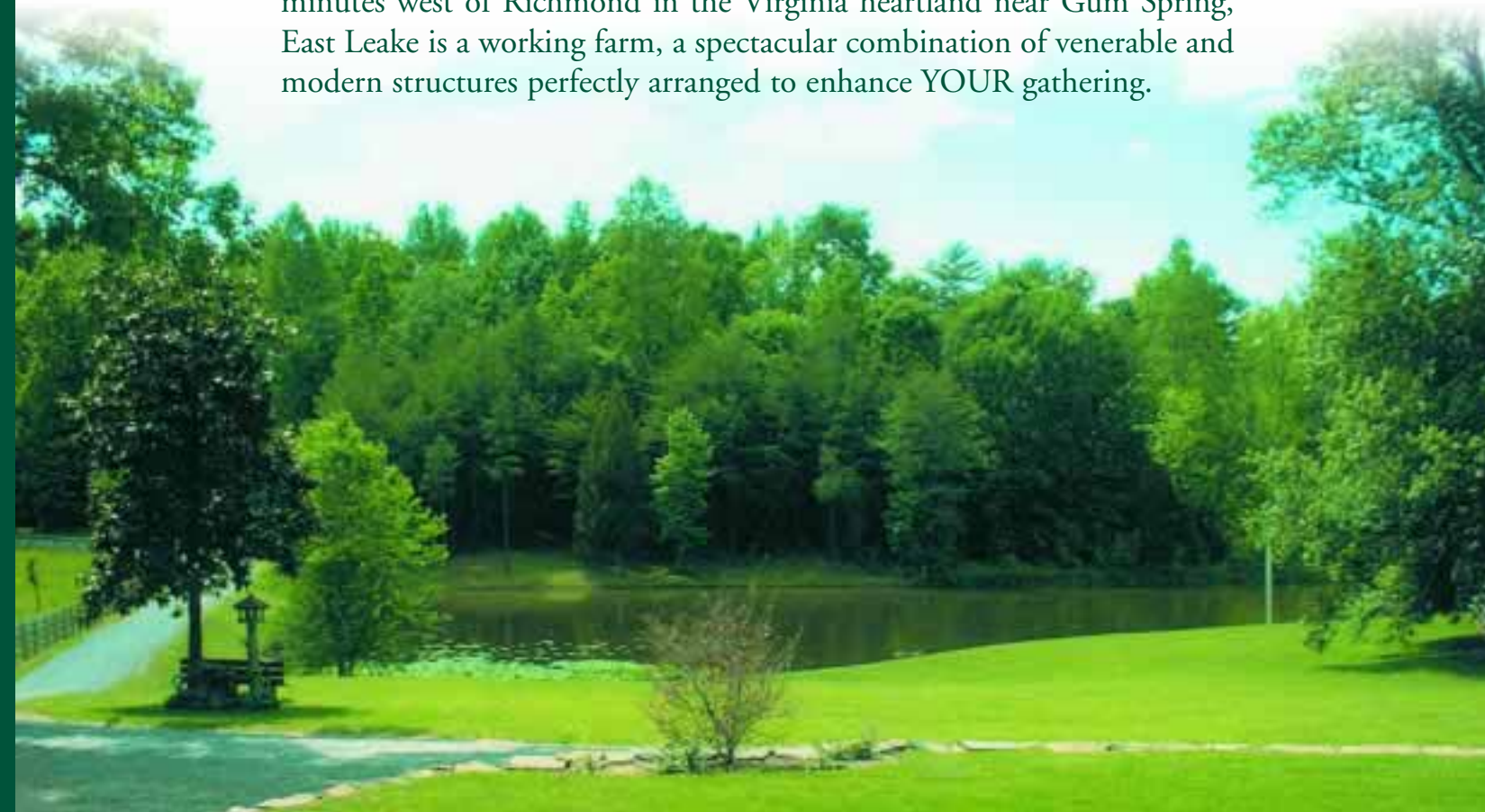

# East Leake Farm



**EAST LEAKE FARM** is a delightful retreat from the intensity of the commercial world, a picturesque gathering place for social and community meetings, or a quiet sanctuary for reflection and renewal. Located twenty minutes west of Richmond in the Virginia heartland near Gum Spring, East Leake is a working farm, a spectacular combination of venerable and modern structures perfectly arranged to enhance YOUR gathering.



*T*HE MAIN HOUSE is a French Country stucco and stone structure, designed to blend into its surroundings; it is an elegant multi-level home with custom features which make it perfect for formal entertaining. A magnificent seven-foot grand piano adorns the greatroom, and a professional pianist is available to entertain your group. Opportunities abound both in this spectacular greatroom and on the grounds for on-site photography.

Two additional homes grace the farm, one of which is suitable for overnight rental. With two bedrooms, stone fireplaces, a kitchen and reception area, this period farmhouse is appropriate for corporate team meetings, showers, receptions, parties, or for that weekend escape into leisure. Gaze out from the wraparound porch across a lotus-filled pond and enjoy ducks, sheep, horses, cattle and peacocks wandering the pristine grounds.

*C*LOSE by are the dependencies: quaint vintage buildings, including a smokehouse, tobacco shed, corn crib, and spring and dairy houses. They remain much the same as when they were built from hand-hewn logs harvested on the farm in the 1800s. A unique gazebo fashioned from the remains of the summer house of Judge Andrew Kean Leake provides an ideal location for quiet meals, bridal showers or receptions. It overlooks a sunken garden with an eight-foot waterfall and a lily pond filled with goldfish. The cook's cabin has been restored as a family library suitable for quiet reading or meditation. There is also an eighteenth century barn overlooking a ten-acre lake. Swimming? Boating?
