Leo Club Members Participate in Flagship Leadership Development Program

The L.A. Host Lions Club has sponsored two Leo Clubs: the L.A. Red Shield Leo Club (for which Lion Irene Lewis is the Advisor) and the El Centro Del Pueblo Leo Club (for which Lion Carlos Martinez is the Advisor). Both Leo Clubs are participating in the Los Angeles Youth Leadership Council (LAYLC), an innovative leadership development collaborative that brings together high school students and staff from six inner-city youth centers.

Since its inception, the Los Angeles Youth Leadership Council has helped more than 300 at-risk teens develop leadership skills. Programs include monthly student meetings, volunteer efforts and community service, SAT prep and college tours, leadership camp, forums with high-profile guest speakers, and job training workshops. Given the drop-out rate in Los Angeles, a most impressive statistic is that every one of the high school seniors last year graduated from high school and went on to some form of higher education.

LAYLC students, many of whom come from low-performing schools and gang-ridden neighborhoods, represent their youth centers at civic and community events across the city and county.

The Los Angeles Youth Leadership Council mirrors the Leo Club Motto:

Leadership - Leos develop skills as organizers, time managers and motivators of their peers.

Experience - Leos learn the importance of cooperation through community service.

Opportunity - Membership provides young people with a chance to excel, to develop positive character traits, and to receive recognition for their contributions to the community.

Through the LAYLC, the Leo Club Programs at The Salvation Army Red Shield and El Centro del Pueblo have been enhanced and strengthened as Leo members show increased leadership skills and a deep desire to make a difference in their communities.
