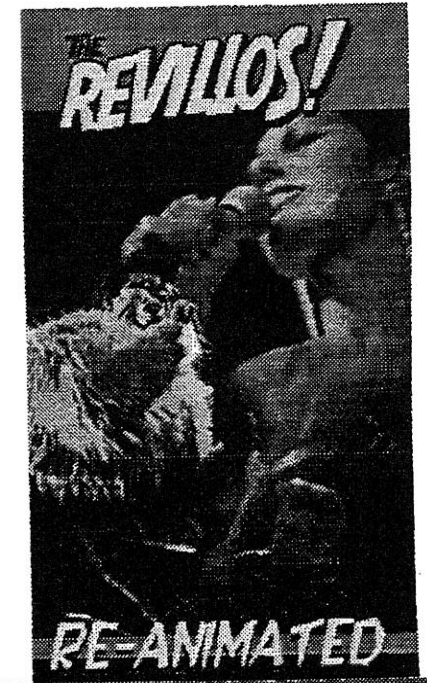


That should have been the end of the story - after a failed sci-fi movie project. the band split: Reynolds went on to two other bands. Rockatomic & Planet Pop. then opened up his own motorbike shop in Edinburgh. Fife did some time with Destroy All Men, then got into film production & acting (the main credit I've seen mentioned for her was the television series TAGGART). However, in 1994. the band reformed for a few gigs in Japan. which led to a live album & a single - which in turn led to more gigs in 1996 and a album of rare tracks, From The Freezer.
