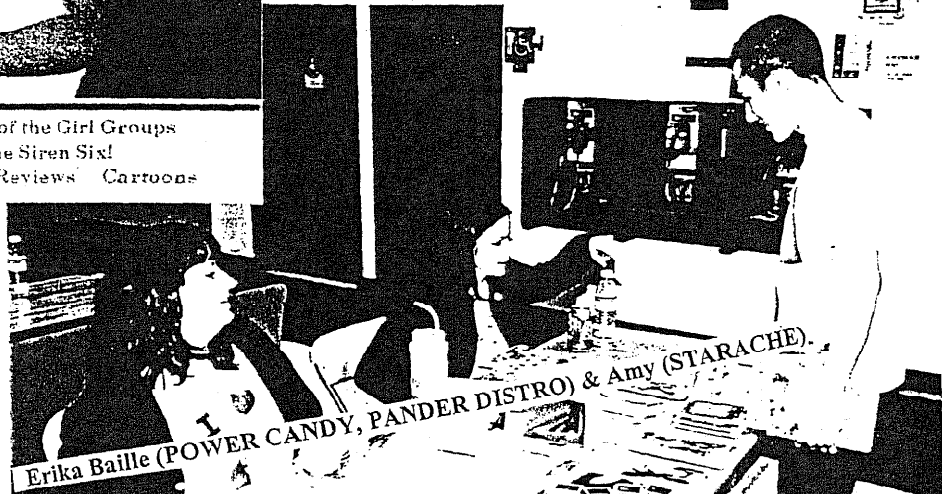

It's a harrowing personal zine by Erika Baille, who takes the reader through her life with a raw & painfully honest accounting. She's a sexual-abuse survivor, so most of the material isn't for the timid or the easily offended. Her writing is incredible - she does a wonderful job in balancing so many things; the heavy/darker issues (her abuse, emotional states) with the lighter side of her life - interesting & poignant, at the very least. I started with Issue #19 - immediately thereafter, I got #18 & plan to order back issues from her. I'm also looking forward to her next writings - it's worth it.
