Local Working Group to hold Public Input Meetings

The Marion County Local Working Group is holding public input meetings at the University of Illinois Extension on February 5th at 1:30 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. The locally led conservation effort is the foundation of the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) conservation program delivery process. The Local Working Group supports the locally led conservation effort by coordinating USDA programs with other Federal, State, tribal and local conservation programs to provide an integrated solution to addressing natural resource concerns. These listening sessions are valuable to the Local Working Group as they work to identify and prioritize natural resource concerns in Marion County. Last year, surveys were mailed to elected officials and distributed at the Farm Bureau breakfast meeting. The surveys provided a good starting point for the identification of concerns. Now, the LWG would like to hear directly from you. Your attendance at the public input meetings is important since this is your opportunity to present concerns directly to the Local Working Group. After the meeting, the LWG will look for solutions to your concerns through a variety of federal, state and local sources.
