GEORGE

JACK

George, when the Aircraft Parts

Manufacturing Association throws

a shindig they really do it right.

JACK AND MEL LOOK AT EACHOTHER AND LAUGH NAUGHTILY.

MEL

APMA conventions are the highlight of my year.

GEORGE

Maybe next time I can go?

JACK

Sure, but you'll have to leave
Angie at home. No wives, if you
know what I mean.

JACK AND MEL LOOK AT EACHOTHER AND LAUGH NAUGHTILY.

GEORGE

Right, you're too cheap to pay for a double room.

MEL

(SOBER) Well, yeah, that too.

JACK

We invited one of the other APMA members to come by for a tour tomorrow, George, so make sure the plant and the employees are properly cleaned up. We really want to look our absolute our best.

(BREATHLESS) Eight to five Lenny

JACK

I'm in!

MEL

Me too. This is better than

Vegas! (TO GEORGE, SOTTO)

Let's just keep Galaxy's visit

to ourselves for now, okay,

George?

GEORGE

You got it. And next time?

Ask for better odds!

AS GEORGE, JACK, MEL AND BENNY EXIT TOWARD THE FIGHT WE:

DISSOLVE TO:

INT. KITCHEN - THAT NIGHT (DAY 1)
(Angie, Carmen)

ANGIE AND CARMEN PREPARE DINNER.

ANGIE

I got a letter from your school today asking parents to volunteer to come in and talk for career day.

CARMEN

The director of the bridal registry at Nieman Marcus is coming in so I think you've been outgunned.

ANGIE

Not me, your father.

CARMEN

He works at a manufacturing plant.

I don't think students at

Allendale are interested in

hearing about life on the

production line.

ANGIE

Your dad's the plant manager.

CARMEN

Yeah, but it's aircraft parts.
Big whoop.

ANGIE

It's important to both of us to actively participate in our children's lives. Your dad's a natural ham, he'll make it fun.

CARMEN

I'm pretty sure they're booked up.

ANGIE

There's a number here to call to ...

CARMEN

(URGENT) No! I mean, you don't have to call. I'll check it out and let you know, okay?

ANGIE

Okay, if that's what you want.

ON ANGIE'S CURIOUS LOOK WE:

DISSOLVE TO:

INT. POWERS AVIATION - THE NEXT DAY - DAY (DAY 2)
(George, Jack, Mel, Mr. Maggit, Muscular Employees #1 & #2,
Plant Extras)

GEORGE LEADS JACK, MEL AND GALAXY CEO MR. MAGGIT INTO HIS OFFICE AND CLOSES THE DOOR.

MR. MAGGIT

I'm genuinely impressed.

JACK

We may not have Galaxy's size but we like to think that works to our advantage.

MEL

(SMILING) We're all like one big family here at Powers.

MUSCULAR EMPLOYEE #1 WALKS BY THE WINDOW WITH A BLACK EYE AND HIS ARM IN A SLING DRAWING EVERYONE'S ATTENTION.

JACK

(PROUD) One big happy family.

MUSCULAR EMPLOYEE #2 HOBBLES BY THE WINDOW ON CRUTCHES.

MR. MAGGIT

Hell of a crew, George!

GEORGE

Thank you, Mr. Maggit.

MEL

George spent nearly twenty
years on the line before becoming
our plant manager. He's a key
reason for our efficiency. He
understands the employee's
perspective and management's.

GEORGE

They're not always the same but

I try to balance everyone's

needs and strike a happy medium.

MR. MAGGIT

But you have to remember who signs your paycheck. Right?

GEORGE

Jack and Mel know how to listen as well as talk. We're fairly democratic around here. I just hope they remember all the nice things they've heard today when it comes time for everyone's raises -- hint, hint.

MR. MAGGIT

Money's the name of the game.

JACK

(SOTTO) George, if things work out the way we hope we'll <u>all</u> be sitting pretty. (WINKS KNOWINGLY)

GEORGE

MR. MAGGIT

JACK / MEL

(IN UNISON) Gobble, gobble.

MR. MAGGIT

Thank you for the tour, George.

GEORGE

Any time.

JACK, MEL AND MR. MAGGIT START TO EXIT.

JACK

(TO CEO MAGGIT) George is right.

Galaxy seems to be buying up

everyone in the business.

MR. MAGGIT

We've definitely had our growing pains but I <u>sure</u> like what I see here at Powers.

 $\underline{\text{JACK,}}$ $\underline{\text{MEL}}$ $\underline{\text{AND}}$ $\underline{\text{MR.}}$ $\underline{\text{MAGGIT}}$ $\underline{\text{EXIT}}$ WITH BIG, KNOWING SMILES AS GEORGE STANDS THERE LOST IN THOUGHT FOR A BEAT.

GEORGE

Gobble, gobble? (THUNDERSTRUCK)
They're going to sell Powers and
we're the turkeys!!

ON GEORGE'S LOOK OF COMPLETE SHOCK WE:

CUT TO:

MAIN TITLES

ACT ONE

INT. KITCHEN - THAT NIGHT (DAY 2)
(George, Angie)

GEORGE IS AT THE COMPUTER.

GEORGE

(HOT) I'm convinced all computers hate me.

ANGIE

That's impossible, George, they're inanimate objects.

GEORGE

Then explain how it is every
computer I touch goes haywire.

ANGIE

How sure are you it's the computers that have the problem?

(BEAT) What is it that you're trying to do?

GEORGE

I want to find out about Galaxy
Aviation, our biggest competitor.
Their CEO came by for a tour today.

ANGIE

(POINTS) Type in Galaxy Aviation there and hit enter.

GEORGE TYPES AND WE SEE FROM HIS REACTION IT WORKED.

GEORGE

Okay, maybe hate is the wrong word.

(READING) Galaxy has become the dominant player through strategic and aggressive acquisition.

ANGIE

You think they're interested in buying Powers Aviation?

GEORGE

I sure got that impression this afternoon.

ANGIE

(READING) It looks like they buy (MORE)

ANGIE (CONT'D)

up their competitors and close the plants and move the work to ...

GEORGE AND ANGIE LOOK AT EACHOTHER WITH SHOCKED SURPRISE.

GEORGE

Mexico!

ANGIE

I can't believe Jack and Mel would sell to a company like that.

GEORGE

The CEO said he was ready to talk turkey.

ANGIE

What did Jack and Mel say?

GEORGE

Gobble, gobble. (BEAT) All my
Hispanic life I've struggled for
a piece of the pie and when I
finally get it I'm sent back to
(MORE)

GEORGE (CONT'D)

(READING) Ciudad Juarez, Mexico!

ANGIE

Don't jump to conclusions, George.

GEORGE

(UPSET) This isn't a rush to judgement -- this is a rush to get my Mexican butt back over the border!

ANGIE

Nobody's sent you anywhere yet.

GEORGE

(MORE UPSET) I can't do it,
Angie, I can't go work at some
border town maquiladora. I've
worked too hard and come too
far!

ANGIE

Hypothetically, what would you do if Jack and Mel sold Powers to Galaxy?

GEORGE

I've only got two years

management and nearly twenty on

the line and no college so I'm

guessing I'll end up back on the

line somewhere. (GLUM) Right

back where I started from.

ANGIE

Maybe you're wrong about all this.

GEORGE

(INCONSOLABLE) I sure hope so, Angie, I sure hope so.

ON GEORGE'S WORRIED LOOK WE:

DISSOLVE TO:

INT. CARMEN'S BEDROOM - LATER THAT NIGHT (DAY 2) (Carmen, Angie)

CARMEN IS ON THE PHONE AND DOESN'T SEE ANGIE ENTER.

CARMEN

(ON PHONE) My dad said he was too busy to do our career day, but maybe next year. (LISTENS)
Okay, I'll see you in biology
lab tomorrow. (HANGS UP)

ANGIE

(STERN) What was that all about, young lady?

CARMEN

(SURPRISED) What do you mean?

ANGIE

Since when has your father been too busy for your school's career day or anything else?

CARMEN

I thought about it and I really (MORE)

CARMEN (CONT'D)

didn't think dad would feel comfortable. I mean, all the parents volunteering have pretty prestigious jobs.

ANGIE

Your dad's the plant manager with a lot of responsibility.

CARMEN

Yeah, but it wasn't that long ago that he was just a blue-collar line worker. Get real.

ANGIE

That's nothing to be ashamed about, Carmen. Your father's worked very, very hard to get where he is. You should be proud of him.

CARMEN

It's not that \underline{I} don't appreciate everything dad's done it's just that others may not.

ANGIE

So the problem is everyone else's perception, not yours?

CARMEN

(SMILES) Exactly.

ANGIE

What better way to change everyone's perception than to invite your dad to come and speak to your class?

CARMEN

Mom, all the parents coming in have Ivy league diplomas and big titles and make tons of money.

Dad would feel (SEARCHES) out of place.

ANGIE

I'm beginning to think it's not your classmates who have the wrong perception. The decision about career day is

(MORE)

ANGIE CONT'D)

yours to make, Carmen, but
I sincerely hope you'll
reconsider.

ANGIE EXITS AND ON CARMEN'S TROUBLED LOOK WE:

DISSOLVE TO:

INT. POWERS AVIATION - THE NEXT DAY - DAY (DAY 3)
(George, Benny, Ernie, Plant Extras)

BENNY AND ERNIE STORM INTO GEORGE'S OFFICE.

BENNY

(HOT) So when exactly were you planning to tell us about the company being sold?!

ERNIE

(HURT) I thought I was your best friend, George.

BENNY

(HOTTER) And the last time I checked I was still your mother, although I hear there may be certain legal proceedings that could change that!

GEORGE

Where did you get the idea that Powers was being sold?

BENNY

Don't be coy, we heard from

Enrique over in shipping who
heard from that VIP's driver
you gave the tour to that he
was from Galaxy Aviation and
he was checking us out 'cause
they're buying Powers and don't
deny it, George!

GEORGE

You know as much as I do.

BENNY

And this VIP is two timing his frigid wife with his secretary.

GEORGE

You know more than I do!

ERNIE

I heard Galaxy buys up their competitors and ships all the work to India.

GEORGE

Mexico.

BENNY

Great, we'll all be making \$1.50 an hour at a maquiladora.

ERNIE

At least we speak the language.

GEORGE

Look, Jack and Mel met the Galaxy
CEO in Vegas and invited him to
drop by for a tour and it could be
as simple as that. I don't believe
they'd sell us all out like that.

BENNY

Boy, did I raise a fool!

Everybody has their price.

ERNIE

Maybe George is right, we are like a family here.

GEORGE

(POINTS) Sure, there's Uncle Jack and Uncle Mel and here's crazy

Aunt Benny.

JACK AND MEL ENTER.

JACK

George, the senior management team from you know where will be dropping by in a few days to see how we do things here and we'd appreciate your participation.

MEL

You're one of the key reasons they're taking a closer look at us, George. (WINKS KNOWINGLY)

BENNY GLARES MURDEROUSLY AT GEORGE.

JACK

If we can impress them like we did the other day we should have some exciting news for everyone.

JACK AND MEL GIVE EACHOTHER HIGH-FIVES.

JACK / MEL

(IN UNISON) Gobble, gobble.

JACK AND MEL EXIT AS BENNY CONTINUES GLARING AT GEORGE.

BENNY

Still think I'm a jive turkey?

ON GEORGE'S WORRIED LOOK WE:

DISSOLVE TO:

INT. KITCHEN - THAT NIGHT (DAY 3)
(George, Angie, Carmen, Max)

GEORGE AND ANGIE GET DINNER ON THE TABLE. GEORGE'S MOOD IS OBVIOUSLY DARK AND HEAVY.

GEORGE

I'm starting to get worried,
Angie. I didn't want to believe
that Jack and Mel would sell
everyone out but it sure looks
that way.

ANGIE

Couldn't there be <u>any</u> other explanation?

GEORGE

I've run everything through my mind a thousand times. What Galaxy said; what Jack and Mel said; this visit coming up from their senior management team.

It all spells one thing.

ANGIE

Ciudad Juarez?

GEORGE

(RESIGNED) Si.

CARMEN AND MAX ENTER.

MAX

Dinner ready, I'm starving?

ANGIE

You had a snack not thirty minutes ago.

MAX

I burned up those calories on my PlayStation. I need new ones.

ANGIE

Dinner is on its way to the table, have a seat. Carmen, was there anything you wanted to say?

CARMEN

No.

ANGIE

Nothing? About your school? Career day? Your father?

CARMEN

Oh, that. Dad, my school is having (MORE)

CARMEN (CONT'D)

a career day and like it's really stupid and boring and all the kids hate it -- except the ones who get out of tests -- and I won't stop you if you really want to participate but it's like a giant waste of time and I totally wouldn't recommend it.

GEORGE

Don't ever go into sales, Carmen.

CARMEN

I should take that as a no then? GEORGE

Sweetheart, the way things are going at Powers the only way I could attend your school's career day is if you had an opening for a unemployed plant manager.

ON GEORGE'S WORRIED LOOK WE:

FADE OUT.

END OF ACT ONE

ACT TWO

Н

FADE IN:

INT. POWERS AVIATION - THE NEXT DAY - DAY (DAY 4)
(George, Benny, Ernie, Plant Extras)

BENNY AND ERNIE ENTER GEORGE'S OFFICE.

ERNIE

Morale is so low I can't get anyone motivated to work.

BENNY

Yeah, everybody is afraid their job is going south of the border.

GEORGE

Not working is a sure way to lose your job, but I can't blame anyone for being worried.

BENNY

I know some people who, for the right amount of money, could make the folks at Galaxy disappear like Jimmy Hoffa.

ERNIE

Maybe we should take up a collection?

GEORGE

I don't think we're ready for Benny's solution but it does seem like we ought to do something to save our jobs.

ERNIE

(LOOKING OUT WINDOW) Look at my crew just sitting there. I bet if those guys from Galaxy saw this they'd think twice about buying this place.

BENNY

(EXCITED) That's it! Their CEO saw a well-oiled machine when he was here. If they saw us at our worst I bet they'd be out of here quicker than crap through a goose.

GEORGE

I don't know, Benny, what if
we're wrong about Galaxy? And
even if we're not, I'm not sure
about taking matters into our own
hands without talking to Jack
and Mel and hearing their side.

BENNY

We've heard their side: gobble, gobble. We'd just be looking out for out for ourselves like they're looking out for themselves!

ERNIE

We have a right to protect our livelihoods, George. (BEAT)

Don't we?

GEORGE

I just want to be fair to everybody involved.

BENNY

Is it fair they're going to (MORE)

BENNY (CONT'D)

sell the plant out from under us and our jobs are going to a maquiladora in Mexico?!

ERNIE

Yeah, what's fair about that?

(TEARY) Breaking up our little
family, that's not fair. Crazy
Aunt Benny is right!

GEORGE

I just think I should talk to Jack and Mel before we decide to make Powers look bad.

BENNY

They're not going to tell you the truth, there's too much money involved.

ERNIE

Money talks, amigo.

BENNY

We need to look out for number one like Jack and Mel. I don't know about you but I ain't no turkey!

GEORGE

Everyone's job is on the line
so everyone should have a vote.

BENNY FLIPS ON THE PA SYSTEM AND LOOKS OUT TO THE PLANT FLOOR AT ALL THE EMPLOYEES SITTING IDLE.

SFX: FEEDBACK SOUND FROM PA SYSTEM.

BENNY'S POV:

BENNY (CONT'D)

(INTO MIC) Attention disgruntled Powers employees. You have a right to a say in your future. You can sit there while the ship goes down or you can join me in mutiny and fight to save your jobs! What's it going to be?

PLANT EXTRAS

(RISING IN ANGRY UNISON) MUTINY!!

BACK TO STANDARD SHOT.

BENNY

The votes are in George, Galaxy is walking the gangplank!

ON GEORGE'S UNCOMFORTABLE LOOK WE:

DISSOLVE TO:

J

INT. CARMEN'S BEDROOM - THAT NIGHT (DAY 4) (Carmen, Amy)

CARMEN AND HER SCHOOL FRIEND AMY SIT TALKING.

CARMEN

I heard Gabriella's parents backed out of career day.

AMY

Yeah, they don't want to cut short their vacation.

CARMEN

Gabriella doesn't take vacations with her parents?

AMY

Lots of kids don't.

CARMEN

That seems strange to me.

AMY

Some girls don't even spend Christmas with their family.

CARMEN

(SURPRISED) Really?

AMY

Sue's dad was too busy
entertaining clients so she
came to my house last year for
Thanksgiving and Christmas.

CARMEN

That's so wrong.

AMY

A lot of girls have parents whose first priority is their career.

You know, making partner, the corner office, all that stuff. If Rene wants to even see her parents she's got to make an appointment.

CARMEN

No way! I wish I could do that with my little brother.

AMY

And even then some of the parents don't pay attention. They just throw money at them and expect them to fend for themselves.

CARMEN

I can't even imagine what that would be like. I mean, we always spend holidays together; we practically trip over each other 24/7; and making an appointment to talk to my mom and dad? I had to run away to get rid of my parents for more than two minutes!

AMY

Of course there are a few perks, like the nice new BMW's or Porches.

CARMEN

But that's just material stuff.

ON CARMEN'S THOUGHTFUL LOOK WE:

DISSOLVE TO:

K

INT. POWERS AVIATION - THE NEXT DAY - DAY (DAY 5)
(George, Jack, Mel, Benny, Ernie, Mr. Maggit, Galaxy
Managers, Plant Extras)

GEORGE LEADS JACK, MEL, MR. MAGGIT AND THE GALAXY MANAGERS INTO THE PLANT.

GEORGE

I'm sorry about that little accident on the loading dock with your controller.

JACK

Our safety record is actually pretty good.

MEL

And the ambulance should be here any second.

BENNY APPROACHES THE THRONG AND CLEARS HER THROAT.

JACK

This is Benny Lopez, George's mother.

BENNY

Try to judge me on my own merits.

MEL

Powers is a real family affair.

SFX: A MACHINE MAKES LOUD GRINDING NOISES.

BENNY

Powers definitely reminds me of family -- loud and dysfunctional.

MEL

Benny has been with us since 1967.

BENNY

As long as some of this equipment!

JACK

We're in the process of upgrading some of our older machines.

BENNY

Maybe the Smithsonian will take them?

MR. MAGGIT

The production figures we've seen must testify to the dedication of the staff if not the equipment then.

BENNY

BENNY (CONT'D)

in their twelve step programs things are definitely flowing more smoothly around here.

MR. MAGGIT

(CONCERNED) Twelve step programs?

BENNY

People around here are kickin'
everything from Twinkies to tar
heroin! This place is a trip!

MR. MAGGIT

I'm beginning to see that.

SFX: AN ATTENTION DRAWING EXPLOSION.

SMOKE POURS FROM A PIECE OF EQUIPMENT AND $\underline{\mathsf{ERNIE}}$ $\underline{\mathsf{EMERGES}}$ AFTER A BEAT COVERED IN SOOT.

ERNIE

(TO GEORGE) If it's a belt like last time I can fix it fast, but if it's the compressor again you better just send the line home.

GEORGE

Thanks, Ernie. Come meet the management team from Galaxy.

ERNIE

I'd shake your hands but mine are covered in axle grease.

MR. MAGGIT

(CONCERNED) Does this sort of thing happen often?

GEORGE

No, this is truly exceptional.

ERNIE

Yeah, usually there's no explosion and far less smoke.

JACK

Ernie here worked his way up the line to become a team leader.

MEL

Tell everyone how proud of that accomplishment you are, Ernie.

ERNIE

Actually, I'm more proud of my ability to keep these old machines going. Speaking of which, duty calls. Nice to meet you folks.

ERNIE EXITS.

MR. MAGGIT

Jack, Mel, I think I was a bit hasty the other day. Why don't you walk us out and maybe we can talk again when things are more settled around here.

GEORGE GIVES AN EXCITED THUMBS UP TO THE PLANT EXTRAS WATCHING AND AFTER <u>JACK</u>, <u>MEL</u>, <u>MR. MAGGIT AND THE GALAXY MANAGERS EXIT THEY ALL LET UP A BIG CHEER.</u>

GEORGE

Congratulations, everyone, it looks like we dodged the bullet!

BENNY

I'm sure glad <u>someone</u> had the guts to stand up and fight.

Thank you, Benny Lopez!

GEORGE

Even if it was fighting dirty.

BENNY

I play to win, Jefe. Besides,

Jack and Mel got what they

deserve trying to hang us out
to dry like that!

BENNY EXITS AND JACK AND MEL RE-ENTER AND APPROACH GEORGE.

JACK

Thanks for the tour, George.

GEORGE

Guess it didn't go too well.

MEL

Murphy's law: everything that could go wrong went wrong.

JACK

We thought we were going to have great news for everybody.

GEORGE

You mean about Galaxy buying us?

MEL

(SURPRISED) We'd $\underline{\text{never}}$ sell Powers to those guys.

JACK

And watch them ship everyone's job to Mexico? Not a chance, George.

MEL

Galaxy was looking for a company to subcontract work to. Mr. Maggit thought we were a good fit. (BEAT) Until today.

JACK

It's a shame, too, because that additional work would've paid for some new equipment and those raises you've been badgering us about.

MEL

Oh well, easy come, easy go.

GEORGE

(LOSING IT) Nooooo!

ON GEORGE'S REACTION WE:

DISSOLVE TO:

INT. KITCHEN - THAT NIGHT (DAY 5)
(George, Angie, Carmen, Max)

THEY ARE EATING DINNER AND LISTENING INTENTLY TO GEORGE.

GEORGE

... and so then Ernie short circuits the punch press and
there's this <u>huge</u> explosion.

Man, you should've seen their
faces! Then out of this shroud
of smoke Ernie emerges looking
like a coal miner at the end of
a long shift.

MAX

What did the Galaxy people do?

GEORGE

They had Jack and Mel show them the door. Fast!

ANGIE

It is a shame about the subcontracting, though.

GEORGE

I'll call the CEO in a couple of days and beg for another chance.

MAX

What are you going to say?

GEORGE

I'll plead, I'll grovel and if all else fails I'll blame it on that notorious mutineer of the high seas -- Blackbeard Benny.

ANGIE

At least everyone still has their job.

GEORGE

Right, so if your school is still looking for volunteers for career day I'm available, Carmen.

A BEAT WHILE CARMEN DRAWS A DEEP BREATH.

CARMEN

I'd love it, Dad.

CARMEN AND ANGIE EXCHANGE WARM, KNOWING SMILES.

GEORGE

And I promise not to embarrass you. (BEAT) Too much.

CARMEN

You won't embarrass me, Dad.

I'm proud of everything you've accomplished. I only hope everyone gets to see the George Lopez I know.

GEORGE

I'll give it my best shot, Carmen.

CARMEN

Thanks, Dad. And Mom.

AS CARMEN HUGS GEORGE AND ANGIE WE:

FADE OUT:

END OF ACT TWO

TAG

FADE IN:

INT. SCHOOL CLASSROOM - DAY (DAY 6)
