Founders of Manakin in the Colony of Virginia

D'Arcie-----Darcy-----Dorsey

Castle D'Arcie once stood where Paris stands in the 10th and 11th centuries.

Christopher D'Arcie was one of the Crusaders to the Holy Land. It was believed that Norman D'Arcie received his name because of his association with William the Conqueror, whom he accompanied to England in 1066. He was the founder of the English family D'Arcy of Darcy.

In Domesday Book, Norman D'Arcie was listed with 33 lordships. In Heralique Nobiliare, the House of Darcy, Darcey is the Noble lines of Chivarly of Chilarly of Norman Origin.

Georgia has had many descendants of the D'Arcy, Darci, Dorsey families who helped to build pioneer Georgia and of whom Georgia is very proud. Several Biographies of the Darcey, Dorsey families have been written among them, "The Way to the Sea," by Florence Dorsey.
