Celgene, previously based in Warren, is a global biopharmaceutical company engaged primarily in the discovery, development and commercialization of novel therapies for the treatment of cancer and inflammatory diseases through gene and protein regulation.

Celgene has approximately 850 employees worldwide, with most of them located in Summit. It generated \$271 million in revenue in 2003, and exceeded a half-billion in 2004 revenue.

Celanese had once employed more than 450 employees at the Summit research center and administrative headquarters, which made the operation one of the city's five largest employers. However, staffing levels had shrunk to approximately 330 at the time it announced in 2003 that it planned to close and sell the Summit site.

## Darcy School financing aided by Economic Development Authority

**CHATHAM TWP.** — The Darcy School, an independent school established seven years ago in Madison, is acquiring a 25,000 square foot vacant three-building complex on 15 acres along Shunpike Road in Chatham, where it will be able to more than double its enrollment and add at least seven new permanent, full-time jobs.

The \$8 million project is being assisted with tax-exempt bond financing provided by the New Jersey Economic Development Authority (EDA). The \$5 million, 20-year bond, directly purchased by

interest only for the first 12 months.

The Darcy School, which serves 110 students in pre-school through sixth grade, has been operating in Livingston since outgrowing its original Madison facility in 2001. The school is fully accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools and is a member of the New Jersey Association of Independent Schools and The National Association of Independent Schools.
