A

Absence

If your child is going to be absent due to illness, please call the office at 266-8487 and leave a message. An absence is recorded as unexcused until a note is received from the parent. When your child returns to school, please send a note that states the date(s) of absence(s) and the reason for the absence(s). An excused absence will be recorded as such if the reason for absence follows School Board policy.

Art

We will have art with Ms. Riggs on Monday.

B

Back Pack

Please have your child bring his/her backpack to school each day.

Birthday

Every child's birthday is special. Please contact us if you would like to send a special snack. Because several incidents of food poisoning have occurred within the county, WCPSS requests that parents not bring homemade food for activities in the classroom. Instead, food provided should be commercially purchased.

Book Club

You will be given the opportunity to order books (or software) from a book club during the school year. Whenever a book order is sent home, you will have three to five days to send money (cash or check) and an order form. When your child brings her/his order form and money, you will receive a

receipt. **If you send book money and do not receive a receipt, please write me a letter.**



Communication

Communication is important. Feel free to write a note, send e-mail (rpmitchell@wcpss.net), or call the school at 266-8487 whenever you have a question or concern!

Conferences

Conferences are held in the fall and the spring; however, we can conference during other times of the year if you or I feel the need to have a conference.

Computers

We have computers in the classroom. We will have computer lab with Mr. Hanna on Friday.



Dress Code

Students are expected to adhere to standards of dress and appearance that are compatible with an effective learning environment. Wearing clothing which is disruptive, provocative, revealing, profane, vulgar, offensive or obscene, or which endangers the health and safety of the student or others is prohibited.

Examples of prohibited dress or appearance include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Attire with messages or illustrations that are lewd, indecent, or vulgar or that advertise any product or service not permitted by law to minors
- Head covering of any kind (male & female)
- See-through attire
- Any adornment such as chains or spikes that reasonably could be perceived as or used as a weapon
- Any symbols, styles or attire frequently associated with intimidation, violence or violent groups about which students at particular schools have been notified.
- Exposed undergarments or excessively short or tight garments
- Sagging pants

- Bare midriff shirts, strapless shirts, or sleeveless shirts (straps must be 2 inches wide.)

F

Fever

If your child is running a fever, please do not send him/her to school. **Your child should be continuously fever free (without any fever reducing medication) for 24 hours before returning to school.**

Field Trips

We will go on field trips. You will receive advance notice of any trips.

Folders

We will send home folders every Monday (or every other Monday). The folder will contain your child's work and school related information. You are to keep the work (unless otherwise indicated), sign the parent signature sheet, and return the parent signature sheet in your child's folder. Sometimes we might send the folders home on a different day. If so, please return the folder the next school day.

G

Grading

Standard Based Grading is the current grading system for elementary schools in Wake County.

- Level 1: Student demonstrates little/no evidence of understanding of grade level objective
- Level 2: Student shows inconsistent performance of grade level objectives and requires teacher guidance.
- Level 3: Student consistently demonstrates understanding of grade level objectives on an independent level
- Level 4: Student consistently performs beyond proficiency

H

Homework

Homework provides additional practice to reinforce the concepts and skills learned in class. It will be assigned Monday through Thursday. Homework is always due the next day unless I state otherwise. Each child will write down the homework assignments in their Student Planner.

I

Illness

We would like to call your attention to the importance of regular school attendance throughout the year. You must keep your child at home if he/she has a fever of 100.5 (or higher), has vomited, or had diarrhea within 24 hours. If your child is ill and unable to come to school, please call 266-8487. When a child returns to school after any absence, he/she should bring a written excuse. **An absence without a written note is counted as unexcused.**

Information

It is **important** to keep all **records current**. Please be sure to inform the school if you move, get a new home phone number, get a new cell phone number, change jobs, or get new emergency contacts.

Invitations

Please do not send **invitations** to school for any off-campus celebrations unless they are for all the students. If your child hands out invitations at school, please invite all the boys, all the girls, or the entire class. If you choose to invite only a few children, please do so by telephone or mail. Children of this age do not understand exclusion and their feelings are hurt very easily. Thank you for your understanding.

Keys to a successful school year

Good communication between home and school, a positive attitude, and good attendance are the keys to a successful school year.



Lunch

We eat lunch from 12:10-12:40. If you plan to eat lunch with your child, you must first go to the office and get a visitor's pass. After you get your visitor's pass, please go to the cafeteria and wait for our class to come. **You are always welcome to join us for lunch; however, please give us a few weeks to establish our routine before visiting.**

Children who buy lunch from the cafeteria are responsible for keeping their lunch money. To eliminate the necessity of having your child carry money every day, you may pre-pay school lunch by the week or month. Since **lunch payments** are computerized, no money on your child's lunch plan is lost if your child is absent or chooses to bring lunch to school.



Mascot

Our mascot is the falcon. Our school colors are green and gold.

We will use the Math Trailblazers program for math.

Media

We will have media with Mrs. Hart on Wednesday.

Medication

School officials may administer medication to students if the Parent Request and Physician Order for Medication (1702) forms are completed and in the possession of school officials. Students may not transport medication. Parents must bring the medication to the school.

No medication can be given unless it is in a container dispensed by a pharmacy. The label should be marked with the student's name, the name of the medication, the date the prescription was filled and clearly marked directions. Short-term medication such as antibiotics may be administered at school during the last days of an acute illness. The pharmacist's label serves as the physician's order. School personnel may not administer over the counter medication without a physician's request.

Students are not allowed to self-medicate with over the counter medication (i.e. cough drops or Tylenol.)

Office

When you arrive on campus, please report to the office first. There you will sign the visitors' log and receive a visitors' pass.

P

Parent-Teacher Conferences

I will schedule parent-teacher conferences during the fall and spring. If you wish to schedule a parent-teacher conference at any time other than the scheduled fall and spring, please send a note.

We will have PE with Mr. Amigh on Tuesday.

Planners

The student planner helps keep students organized and maintains daily communication between school and home. Please look for your child's planner each night and send it back to school each day.

Reading

Please have your child read a minimum of 20 minutes each night. Depending on your child's reading ability, this could be buddy reading, silent reading, or oral reading. Also, remember a child is never too old to be read aloud to. Choose a book they could not read alone or a family favorite.

Rules

Please review our rules with your child. It is important that your child understands and follows our classroom rules.



School Hours

School begins at 9:15 and ends at 3:45. Students may enter the building any time after 8:45 to prepare for the day. **Children should not arrive on campus before 8:45 unless they are enrolled in the Early Arrivals Program.** If you (or someone else) drop off your child in the morning or you are on campus, please do not let your child come into the building nor into the classroom unless it is after 8:45.

If you check out your child early (anytime before 3:45 is considered early), you should go to the office and sign out your child. **Please write a note if**

you are going to pick up your child early. If I know ahead of time that your child is leaving early, I can gather necessary items and help your child have an easier transition of leaving early.

School Supplies

You are asked to provide the following school supplies.

For personal use:

- 1 non-rolling backpack
- 2 three-subject notebooks (specials, writing)
- 4 one-subject spiral bound notebooks (reading, 2-math, science)
- 1 pack of colored pencils (no markers please)
- 1 pack of crayons (no more than 48)
- 1 pencil pouch
- 1 set of multiplication flash cards
- 1 handheld pencil sharpener with a lid
- 5 plastic 2-pocket folders
 - Purple: Homework
 - Blue: Unfinished Work
 - Green: Reading
 - Yellow: Multi-Purpose
 - Orange: Multi-Purpose

For classroom use:

- 4 packs of wide-ruled notebook paper
- 1 ten pack of pronged 2 pocket folders
- 24 number 2 pencils
- 3 boxes of Kleenex
- 1 box of baby wipes
- 2 boxes of gallon zip-loc bags (boys only)
- 2 boxes of quart zip-loc bags (girls only)

For home use:

- Pencils
- Notebook paper
- Scissors
- Glue
- 1 set of multiplication flash cards
- Crayons/colored pencils

Snack

We will have time for a **working snack** each day. Children should bring their own healthy snack (fruit, cheese, crackers, etc.). **Since the children will not store their snacks in a refrigerator, please only send snacks that require no refrigeration.**

Spelling

Your child will have a **spelling test** each Friday. We will use the spelling program that is embedded in the Houghton Mifflin reading series. Each week we will work on a different phonemic pattern.



Tardy

If a child arrives at school after the 9:15 start time, he/she is tardy. If your child is late for school, you must accompany him/her to the office to sign the tardy log.

Transportation

You are asked to let us know how your child gets to and from school. If your child's transportation is going to change, it is important you write a note. **If we do not have written communication that your child will go home a different way, she/he will be sent home the way she/he normally goes home.**



Unexcused Absence

Any absence without a written explanation will be recorded as unexcused. An absence will be recorded as unexcused if the reason for absence does not follow School Board policy.



Volunteers

We love volunteers! Please write a note if you are interested in volunteering this year. All volunteers must use a Wake County Public School System computer to complete the online volunteer registration form. You must be a registered volunteer to chaperone on field trips.

Our Parent Teacher Association (PTA) is also looking for volunteers. They have a sign up sheet. When you come to help, you must sign in at the office and get a visitor's pass.

If you wish to volunteer but work during school hours, please write a note or send an e-mail (rpmitchell@wcpss.net). We will discuss ways you can help outside of school hours. Some possibilities are working as a library parent or preparing materials (cutting, coloring, gluing) for the class.
