Anthropology and Sociology Club Constitution

The Preamble- Anthropology and Sociology Club Purpose: To provide an open forum for all those interested to discuss all things dealing with anthropology and sociology. To make information and events in the anthropology and sociology circles readily available to those interested in anthropology, sociology and world events.

Article I – Name of Organization- Anthropology and Sociology Club

Article II – Membership- Open to all without regard to age, race, creed or religion, color, handicap, sex, national origin, ancestry, sexual orientation or political affiliation.

Article III – Officers –

- Officer positions include President and Vice-President.
- Officers must have at least a 2.00 GPA and have had at least one previous course in anthropology or sociology.
- Candidates for officers must have Faculty Advisor approval and be voted in by the majority vote of a quorum of members.
- Elections held beginning of October for fall and spring semesters.
- President shall work with advisor to coordinate events and organize funds.
- Vice-President shall take over duties of president if he or she is unavailable for meetings or events. Vice-President shall take over duties of the President if he or she (President) cannot fulfill duties and is voted out with majority of quorum present.

Article IV – Meetings – Meetings will be called by President or Faculty Advisor.

Article V – Finances – In the event of dissolution of club, any membership dues paid will be refunded evenly to paid members with event costs incurred before dissolution in mind.

Article VI – Amendments – Amendments must be submitted to group at regular meeting. Two-thirds affirmative vote from members must be attained to amend constitution. Faculty Advisor must be consulted before adding amendment.
