*Mission Statement of the Eli Whitney College Online:* Our commitment is to the individual growth of each of our students. Our online approach allows us to reach out to those who might not otherwise be able to receive an education. As such, our college is displayed as an unusually hands-on and comprehensive institution. The Eli Whitney College is committed to allowing young professionals: learn, live, and explore. You must learn to increase your base of knowledge. You must live to expand your ways of learning. *Statement of Accreditation of the Eli Whitney College Online:* The Eli Whitney College is not currently seeking peer-evaluated accreditation, though our strength of program is well-known throughout the academic world. We are not recognized by any United States or International Educational bureaus.

*Certificate/Degree Programs:* The Eli Whitney College offers online students the chance to receive the Online Continuing Studies Certificate. Students must take a minimum of 9 credits, with at least one course in each of the different divisions (other than the John Q. Adams Division of Non-Traditional Study) at the College. Students cannot take more than one class per term for the certificate. The same class cannot be taken for credit more than once. Independent studies cannot count for more than 6 credits towards the certificate. Upon obtaining enough credits for the certificate, alert the University by e-mailing [mrhealthnutcoceo@yahoo.com](mailto:mrhealthnutcoceo@yahoo.com). Your certificate will typically be e-mailed to you within five to ten working days. A \$2 fee payable by PayPal ([www.paypal.com](http://www.paypal.com)) will be charged should you wish to have your certificate mailed to you.

*Transcript Information:* Transcripts are available by e-mailing [mrhealthnutcoceo@yahoo.com](mailto:mrhealthnutcoceo@yahoo.com), along with your first name, xanga web address, and dates of attendance. Turnaround times vary, however, typically within one week of your e-mail; a printable transcript will be e-mailed to you. Unofficial transcripts may be either e-mailed (free for the first three--- one after each class towards the certificate, \$1 afterwards) or mailed by regular USPS mail. A \$2 fee is charged for all mailed unofficial transcripts.

Please contact us by e-mail ([mrhealthnutcoceo@yahoo.com](mailto:mrhealthnutcoceo@yahoo.com)) for an official transcript to be sent to employers, colleges, or other institutions. Please include your first and last name, xanga web address, dates of attendance, and the names/addresses of such institutions. We will attempt to send out transcripts within one week of notification from the student but it may not be possible to do so, depending on volume of requests or other intermittent factors. Official transcripts must be mailed by regular USPS mail. A \$5 fee is charged per transcript.

*Payment Information:* All of the Mr. Health Nut Co CEO services are offered free of charge to students. Our fees for mailings and transcripts are to cover costs incurred in the shipping and handling of said transcripts. Charges cover postage, envelopes, ink, paper, and labor costs. ## **CLASS OFFERINGS**

### **Lucretia Mott Division of Career Disciplines, Mathematics and Sciences**

*The Sciences division of the Eli Whitney College is named after one of the great feminists of all time; the name shows our dedication for equality in the sciences. Our program gives students background in the traditional “hard” sciences and the new branches of Computer Science and Career Disciplines including business.*

**Sci 118b (3 credits)** - Intro to Geologic and Environmental Studies- (Offered 2004/2005)  
- A look at the principles of geology, biology and environmental studies. Students will come out with a firm grasp of basic concepts in the three subjects and their interrelations. Specific focus on how earthly events affect man and the processes of earth. Readings from your local newspaper or the New York Times will be required.

**Cdi 187 (3 credits)** - International Business- (Not Yet Offered) - Introduction to management within an international context. The course covers development of trade, trade theories, impact of trade and foreign direct investment on countries, and the basic principles of exchange rates and global financial markets. Looks at managerial complications arising from different socio-cultural conditions.

**Sci 187 (3 credits)** - Intro to Computing and HTML Web Page Coding- (Offered 2006)-  
An overview of web based applications including simple website design aspects. Course will include basic computing tasks such as Microsoft Word and Excel applications. It will also introduce the student to basic Hypertext Markup Language work. Access to Adobe Photoshop is helpful for this course.

**Sci 193 a-z (3 credits)** - Topics In Science and Mathematics - (Not Yet Offered) - Topics offered as needed. May be repeated for credit if specified topic changes.

**Sci 194 a-z (3 credits)** - Topics In Applied Science and Mathematics - (Not Yet Offered)-  
Topics offered as needed. May be repeated for credit if specified topic changes.

## **Crispus Attucks Division of the Social Sciences, Arts and Humanities**

*The Humanities and Social Sciences division of the Eli Whitney College is named after one of the greatest African-Americans of all time; the name shows our dedication for equality in education. Our program gives students background in the traditional humanities and social science subjects.*

**Hum 121d** (3 credits) - The Harry Potter Phenomenon- (Offered 2005/2006)- Harry Potter mania is in full force in the United States and the world. And with recent film activity and the much-anticipated release of future books, it's not likely to slow down. Course takes a close look at the books themselves; including the plots, characters and themes that weave together to create the highly popular, somewhat controversial world of Harry Potter. As part of an attempt to pinpoint just what it is about the books that have made them so successful and so popular, students not only read the books, but also explore some theoretical work dealing with myths, heroes and initiation rites.

**Soc 191** (3 credits - formerly Hum 193b)- History of the Ottoman Empire and the Middle East- (Offered 2005/2006)- This course looks at the history of the Middle East with specific focus on the Ottoman Empire. Students will learn Middle Eastern Geography, the social history of one of the most successful empires in history, and get a grasp on Islamic thought. Students will be well grounded in Historical approaches to the globe. Textbooks are required for this course, so please e-mail the professor for textbook information.

**Hum 193 a-z** (3 credits) - Topics In Social Sciences, Arts and Humanities - (Not Yet Offered) - Topics offered as needed. May be repeated for credit if specified topic changes.

**Hum 194 a-z** (3 credits)- Topics In Applied Social Sciences, Arts and Humanities - (Not Yet Offered)- Topics offered as needed. May be repeated for credit if specified topic changes.

## **John Q. Adams Division of Non-traditional and Independent Study**

*The Independent Study/Non-traditional division of the Eli Whitney College offers classes that cannot count for the Online Continuing Studies Certificate except in cases when it is previously accepted by the Independent Study advisor.*

**Nts 101** (3 credits- formerly Sci 110) - Intro to College Level Work- A course designed to ease the transition to college (especially in an online environment), hone college-level skills, and introduce students to the resources offered to them at the Eli Whitney College Online. Aspects of psychology will be taught in the course, though this is not equivalent to an introductory psychology class. This course will involve many written assignments and requires reading from a local newspaper or the New York Times. Nts 101 may *not* be applied to the “Humanities” or “Sciences” division under any circumstances.

**Ind 103a** (*var credits*) - Independent Study in Humanities- (Offered 2005/2006)- Instructor guided independent study topics of interest to the student. May be applied to the “Humanities” Division Requirement when applicable.

**Ind 103b** (*var credits*) - Independent Study in Arts- (Offered 2005/2006)- Instructor guided independent study topics of interest to the student. May be applied to the “Humanities” Division Requirement when applicable.

**Ind 103c** (*var credits*) - Independent Study in Mathematics- (Offered 2005/2006)- Instructor guided independent study topics of interest to the student. May be applied to the “Sciences” Division Requirement when applicable.

**Ind 103d** (*var credits*) - Independent Study in Sciences- (Offered 2005/2006)- Instructor guided independent study topics of interest to the student. May be applied to the “Sciences” Division Requirement when applicable.

**Ind 103e** (*var credits*) - Independent Study in Social Sciences- (Offered 2005/2006)- Instructor guided independent study topics of interest to the student. May be applied to the “Sciences” Division Requirement when applicable.

**Ind 103f** (*var credits*) - Independent Study in Topics not offered- (Offered 2005/2006)- Instructor guided independent study topics of interest to the student. Ind 103f may *not* be applied to the “Sciences” or “Humanities” Division Requirements except by special permission.
