1. Stamp Act _____	A. Skirmishes that marked the beginning of the American Revolution.
2. Townshend Acts _____	B. An assembly of representatives from the 13 colonies. At first they met to organize resistance to English taxes, but later they wrote the <i>Declaration of Independence</i> .
3. Tea Act _____	C. A world-wide conflict between France and England.
4. Intolerable Acts _____	D. A period of great advances in science that lasted from around 1500-1700. It changed the way Europeans approached learning about the world around them.
5. Lexington and Concord _____	E. An intellectual movement in the 1700s that involved science, economics, politics, history, and other areas of study. This movement was characterized by a belief in the power of human reason to understand the world.
6. Proclamation of 1763 _____	F. Changes in the 1700s-1800s that involved a shift from home-based hand production to large-scale factory production. Along with this change came the growth of cities as well as other effects.
7. Industrial Revolution _____	G. Laws that placed taxes on glass, lead, paint, paper, and tea to the colonies. England lost money from colonists boycotting the items that were being taxed and repealed the laws.
8. Scientific Revolution _____	H. A law that authorized the East India Company to bypass American merchants and sell tea directly to the colonies.
9. The Enlightenment _____	I. A law that placed taxes on legal documents, almanacs, newspapers, pamphlets, and playing cards. It was the first direct tax Parliament had ever placed on the colonies and led colonists to boycott English goods.
10. East India Company _____	J. Called the Coercive Acts by the English. These laws closed Boston's harbor to trade, forbade town meetings more than once a year, allowed for English troops to stay in unoccupied homes in the city, and appointed an English army general as Massachusetts' royal governor.
11. Continental Congress _____	K. The name for colonists who supported the English during the American Revolution.
12. Tories _____	L. When English soldiers under Captain Thomas Preston fired on a Boston crowd, killing five and wounding six.
13. French and Indian War _____	M. An English company created by the English government to develop trade with the British colonies in India and southeast Asia.
14. Boston Massacre _____	N. A law that made it illegal for colonists to move into land west of the Appalachian Mountains.
