He needs to convert his Word doc into a PDF and then delete pages. The IT folks there Primo PDF. Does anyone know if Primo PDF will allow you to delete pages or is it just : need to edit elements on the page, just delete pages.

(Basically, he's creating 2 PDF files - one is the black and white section, the other will diagrams with some text. Doing this is cheaper than printing the whole thing color.)

Any advice greatly appreciated!

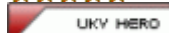

I guess the only thing he'd have to worry about with doing that would be making sure t all the page numbers and chapter headings in the right places for when the B&W and c put back together for binding.

His thesis is over 350 pages with about 150 color pages scattered throughout. By converting PDF first and then having 2 copies of that, one with the black and white pages, one with the color pages, he shouldn't have pagination issues (he'll collate the pages himself, then have it spiral bound, then have it printed at the Uni print shop. Mort, your idea is the last resort as these places are resistant to specifying pages for some reason (time I assume, and probably added cost to boot).

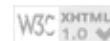
