chapter's recent accomplishments. We have been busy working on many different projects while also donating time to a plurality of events. As the start of the semester, we attended the Oklahoma Art Educators state conference at Oklahoma State University in Stillwater. At this conference, students set up and operated a booth to promote the upcoming Scholastic Arts Competition which is sponsored by The University of Tulsa for the Oklahoma Chapter. Our students not only promoted the Scholastics Competition, but also many upcoming art related events in Oklahoma. Besides volunteering at the booth, each student participated in the guest lecture and took full advantage of the many interesting workshops.

After the state conference our chapter participated in a local fundraiser for the Child Abuse Network of Tulsa. The fundraiser, held at a local movie theater, played an I-Max movie featuring the exploration of the Titanic: our chapter created six, 4x4 foot panels depicting scenes from the movie. The panels came out very nice. The scenes ranged from depictions of the grand staircase inside the Titanic to representations of the underwater shipwreck. The panels were prominently displayed outside the theater in the midst of a Titanic themed festival.

Furthermore, in an earnest effort to attend the conference this March, we have been engaged in multiple fundraising
