### "Dutch Courage" - Gopal Bharatham

### Introduction


There are ten worksheets altogether for students to work with Gopal Bharatham's "Dutch Courage." The worksheets are arranged in sequence from lesson to lesson according to stages. The first two worksheets are done to introduce the story. The next six worksheets contain activities that intrigue students to read further. These activities are thought provoking and help students to understand the story. They also introduce literary conventions and elements such as character study, plot, theme, figure of speech and setting. Though they are not implicitly introduced the activities subtly introduce these elements to the students. The worksheets are also done with consideration of students ability to be able to do them. The last two worksheets help to consolidate students reading of the story. They help to conclude the story and bring it to a close. Writing the report not only involves reading but writing critically as well. Writing a journalistic report helps students to present the facts clearly. They also have to interview imaginary characters. In fact the teacher can hold a role playing session where students assume the role of the characters while others interview them. This would help student to delve deeply into the feelings of the characters. The last worksheet deals with writing an epitaph for the leading character, Cornelius. In the story Cornelius dies sacrificing his life to save his wife. It was a heroic things. Students would very much like to write an epitaph for such a character, However it can also be hilarious as some of the example epitaphs show. Either way the students would enjoy writing it.

In doing the worksheets I have referred to the Class readers Theory and Practise book and some of the teaching files. Apart from that, references were made to several other books. Hence some of the worksheets have activities that are adapted from these books. The objectives and rationale had been derived from the literature syllabus prepared by the Ministry of Education.





4. Father Noonan was not as terrified as Cornelius even though he was an easy target on his little motor-bike. Was it merely Dutch courage? Elaborate.






