## Household Hazardous Waste Day, April 25



Attached for distribution to your networks, both electronic and via paper where appropriate (such as posting at work and on community bulletin boards) is our flyer for this year's, our second annual, hazardous waste and electronics recycling day. It will be held once again in the Home Depot parking lot, AIA & Chester Road in Yulee, on Saturday, April 25, from 9 to 2 p.m. The hazardous waste part was a tremendous success last year, surprising both us and the state DEP experts with our citizen response. The City of Fernandina

Beach will also be holding a Spring Greening Recycling Event the same day at their 8th and Lime St. lot on the island that will also accept electronics, as well as other recyclables, such tires for city residents, plastic and aluminum, car batteries, and waste oil. Their flyer, attached, refers to our event.

The distribution of this flyer through our networks is a key part of how we inform citizens of this great opportunity to increase the amount of what we recycle, and avoid putting hazardous materials into the landfill

that have the potential to contaminate our groundwater. So thanks for your help in getting the word out through your networks. Because we are so close to recycling, we forget how important it is: Recycling I glass jar saves enough electricity to light a conventional 60W bulb for 4 hours or an IIW Energy Star bulb for 20 hours. Recycling a stack of newspapers just 3 feet high saves I tree. And this is the "safe" stuff's impact on the environment, with no mercury, lead or other toxins in them, relatively speaking.

# Tour of JaxPort Blount Island Port Terminal

### Friday April 3<sup>rd</sup> 10am - noon

This promises to be a great trip, hosted by Director of Marine Operations...Fernandina's own Victoria Robas. It will be a great inspiration for the girls to see such a feminine woman in a traditionally male dominated field! Victoria has coordinated a bus tour of the port facilities (which includes shipping, rail & trucking) plus a presentation of the port operations in their office. I have asked if we could also tour the new Japanese port expansion. We chose a Friday for the trip, as this is a busy day at the port, and hopefully we'll get to see a lot of action!!

We will meet in the Security Building Parking Lot and then divide into 2 pre-assigned groups.

The tour is limited to 46 people maximum – as there are only 23 seats on their tour bus.

Half our group will begin with the bus tour, while the other half will begin with the presentation in the office. The two groups will switch after aprox. 45 minute session.

#### Who:

This tour is limited to  $\frac{4^{th}}{grade}$  grade & up...mainly because of the length of the bus tour...too long and 'boring' for little guys that may make it difficult to hear the narration.

The 46 person head count includes adults as well as kids...so plan carefully who would get the most out of the trip! JaxPort needs the names of each member attending, plus ages for the kids. **Bring a photo ID.** 

(If you take any medications with <u>radiation</u>, or will have had a <u>radiation</u> stress test just before the tour, you will be unable to attend, as the <u>radiation</u> will set off monitors at the port which will delay the tour bus.) Contact me with any questions regarding participation.

#### **Getting There:**

Coming from Amelia Island, the best way is to take Hecksher Drive. You will enter Blount Island from Hecksher onto Blount Island Blvd. There are intermittent bridge closures for construction at the Sisters Creek Bridge between at 9:30am & 1:30pm. These are scheduled to be complete by April, but plan to be over the bridge by 9:30 when the first closure is scheduled.

Coming from off the island, you may want to drive US17 or 95 to 9A then exit onto Hecksher Drive and go East. (There is construction at the 9A-Hecksher exit, so beware!) You will enter Blount Island from Dave Rawls Blvd.

Either way, there will be a bit of construction to deal with, so plan accordingly.

I have attached a map of the entrances to Blount Island, showing the Security Bldg meeting spot

#### Be prepared:

It would be great to do a transportation study prior to the trip...you can find out some things about the port at <a href="www.jaxport.com">www.jaxport.com</a> ...have those questions ready!!

#### Plan a Picnic:

After the tour, bring your lunch to the Zoo's Picnic Area...just about 5 minutes down the road...for those adventurous, you can add a zoo afternoon to your day!! There is a Wendy's on the way to the zoo for those who aren't early morning packers!

Arrive at the port at 9:45, as we will begin PROMPTLY at 10am. If you're not there you'll miss out!
