Co-Presidents (Husband & Wife)

A. Direct and preside over the Group Leadership and regular support group meetings.

B. Organize and preside over planning meetings.

 Set the time and place and prepare the agenda.

2. Have needed input from all chairmen prepared & available.

 With the Treasurer, prepare a draft budget.

> Notify the membership of the meeting, budget and agenda in the preceding Newsletter.

C. Prepare agendas for Group Leadership and regular meetings.

> For regularly scheduled
> Group Leadership meeting an agenda will be published in the preceding month's Newsletter.
> For special Group Leadership meetings or other meetings, agenda will be provided at the meeting.

 Everyone involved should receive a typed copy the day of the meeting, including any guest speakers, with time estimates to keep the meeting on schedule.

3. Agendas should be dated

and provided to the secretary for filing.

D. Maintain communications with support group committees. Coordinate between committees. Assist committees in getting the resources needed to be successful.

 Try to stay abreast of the support group committees6 plans and activities.

 If necessary, request regular progress reports on critical assignments.

> 3. Try to help everyone to do the job they volunteered to do. Some people may have emergencies, some may experience burnout, some may forget. A short telephone call may make a big difference!

E. Act as the contact person for new home schooling families and direct them to resources needed for their success and membership. the year 2009-2010 Leadership Team.

 Try to welcome new people individually after meetings or events.

> As requested, refer new members to specific books, or other resources that may help them.

4. Provide your

phone number to the local public school district and to home school organizations (i.e. HERI, FPEA, HEF, etc.), so those considering home schooling or home schoolers moving to the area have a contact number.

 Provide applications to those interested in becoming a member. F. Act as the group contact person with other home education organizations, especially the Home Education Resources & Information (HERI) FORUM, the Florida Parent Educators Association (FPEA) and the Home Education Foundation (HEF).

 List your name and the information number with these organizations.

G. Be familiar with Florida home school laws and be able to explain them.

- Attend the Florida state FPEA convention whenever possible.
- Consider being a member of the Home School Legal Defense Assn.
- Attend the NE Florida HERI convention whenever possible.
- Maintain at least annual contact with HEF to be abreast of legislative activity.

H. Make recommendations to the Group Leadership as to the committee chairmanships required and distribute any required tasks, which will not be handled by a committee chairman among the Group Leadership or other committee chairmen. (For example, the Information Packet Chairman duties could be assigned as part of the President's responsibilities as the support groups contact person, or the Newsletter Editor could handle the timing coordination function of the Field Trip Coordinator since all support group field trips and activities must be published in the Newsletter.]
