

STATE PARKS INVITE VISITORS TO ENJOY October EVENTS

Talbot Islands hosts interpretive programs for the entire family-

JACKSONVILLE – The Florida Department of Environmental Protection's Talbot Islands State Parks invite visitors to explore the area's natural environment throughout the month of October. Visitors will have the chance to discover the importance of the wildlife and vegetation that is part of north Florida's barrier islands.

October programs include:

Trekking on a Trail; Big Talbot Island State Park

Saturday, October 4th at 11:00 a.m.

Join a park ranger for an introduction to the basics of hiking. Weather, wildlife tracking, trail safety and proper gear will all be discussed. The program will take place at the Bluffs pavilion on Big Talbot Island. No reservations are necessary and the program is free with \$2 vehicle entrance fee.

Shark Teeth; Fort George Island Cultural State Park

Sunday, October 12th at 11:00 a.m.

Join a park ranger for a discussion on the different types of shark teeth that can be found on the area's beaches. This program will take place at the Ribault Club on Fort George Island Cultural State Park. No reservations are necessary and the program is free.

Beach Walk; Little Talbot Island State Park

Saturday, October 18th at 11:00 a.m.

Join a park ranger for a walk on the beach as they explain the importance of undeveloped beach habitat, including many interesting facts about sea creatures and common shells found in the area. The program will take place at pavilion five on Little Talbot Island. No reservations are necessary and the program is free with regular park admission.

Talbot Critter; Little Talbot Island State Park

Sunday, October 26th at 1:00 p.m.

Join a park ranger to learn about the many common species that inhabit the natural communities of the undeveloped barrier islands of northeast Florida. The program will take place at pavilion six on Little Talbot Island. No reservations are necessary and the program is free with regular park admission.

The Florida Park Service is dedicated to providing programs that are accessible to all. Persons with special needs which may limit participation or enjoyment of any program should advise the park in advance so assistance with reasonable accommodations can be provided.

On October 11th, we are taking a field trip to the Okefenokee Wildlife Refuge. October 11th is a Saturday and coincides with the Annual Okefenokee Festival. In addition to the Visitor Center, the boardwalk and hiking trails, on that day, from 11:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., the Chesser Island Homestead will have an Open House to showcase how people once lived in Southeast Georgia. We can see how settlers made soap, brooms, butter, quilts, baskets, and other everyday items. We can examine how settlers washed clothes, smoked meat, made pickets, and survived in and around the swamp. We can sample boiled peanuts, soup, biscuits, and other items cooked on a wood-burning stove. We can listen to the sounds of bluegrass music, stories, and four-note singing. We can encounter horses, mules, and other livestock. And enjoy the games your grandparents played - musical chairs, wheelbarrow races and more! Additionally, in Folkston, there will be a parade that morning to coincide with this special day.

While I don't think attending all of these events as a group is feasible, I have arranged for our home school group to have a **boat tour at 2:00 p.m.** at a discounted price, if we can get a group of 10 together - \$14.40 for ages 12 and up, \$9.00 for ages 5-11, free for kids 4 & under. The boat tour lasts for 90 minutes and you can read more about it at

http://www.okefenokeeadventures.com/tours.htm. Additionally, if you would like to participate with us, we can get the refuge entry fee of \$5 waived. If you are interested, please contact me by October 4th, so we can make arrangements for you to get an entry fee waiver, as well as where to plan to meet for the boat tour.
