Overview of Supplemental Instruction

Description

Supplemental Instruction (SI) is a nationally recognized academic assistance program that utilizes **free**, peer-assisted study sessions. SI sessions are regularly-scheduled, informal reviews sessions that coincide with lecture topics in which students compare notes, discuss readings, develop organizational tools, and predict test items. Students learn how to integrate course content and study skills while working together.

Purpose

- (1) To increase retention rates within targeted historically difficult courses
- (2) To improve student grades in targeted historically difficult courses
- (3) To increase the graduation rates of students

How SI Works

SI sessions are facilitated by "SI Leaders," undergraduate students who have previously taken the course and demonstrated academic competency in the subject area. SI leaders attend course lectures, take notes, read all assigned materials, and conduct three to five out-of-class SI sessions a week. Sessions coincide with lecture topics for the current week. As a result, please make sure your **attendance is consistent**.
