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

Malverne - Brief History

Founded in 1989, the Fredrikstad-class USS Malverne is based on the Ariel-class shuttlecarrier. The main difference externally is the addition of shuttle landing pads and increased weaponry on the ship. Internal layout of the ship has been facilitated and extra shuttle bay space laid out for the increased compliment of shuttlecarriers. The Ariel and Fredrikstad classes both have a large primary hull, a

wedge shape secondary hull and a long interconnecting dorsal between them.



Now that BGN Neigut is leaving to form his own ship, and subsequently a MSG, that will leave the 41st without a leader. Who better to take the reigns but our own commanding officer? After all, he started the 41st when the Malverne was still a shuttle. That makes the 41st one of the oldest MSG's in existence.

The 41st is one of only two permanently-embarked ground-force units aboard the Malverne, the other being the First Surface Action Detachment (Ranger). The 41st provides liaison and terminal strike guidance/landing area control



when serving with other units temporarily deployed aboard Malverne. As a free-standing unit, the 'Fianna' serve as a conventional Fleet Marine Force with the additional role of combat search and rescue for downed aerospace assets.
