Rex was born in Masterton in 1946; Rex attended Central School in Masterton, followed by Wairapapa College. Enthusiastic about sport, Rex took part in athletics, hockey, basketball, and yachting and represented the Wairapapa province at hockey.

In 1964 he joined the police force and after his 18 month training, he was stationed at Wellington Central. Later posts included Wellington Wharf on the police launch Lady Elizabeth, Porirua and Wanganui before coming to Nelson in 1978. Armed Offenders work has been a large role in his life. His recent retirement after 25years marked the end of the longest service in this highly stressful job for any NZ Police Officer. Rex lead the Nelson squad for many years. He has also been active in raising public

awareness of policing in Nelson Rex and Jo have 4 children and 3 .8 grand children.

In his spare time Rex is trying his hand at calligraphy, leadlight and glass work as well as keeping fit in a regular running regime.

He is an active member of the St Mary's church community and supported his children at St Josephs school including coaching basketball and helping on school camps. He is also keen for more travel, but when time is in short supply, this becomes limited.

His roles in Rotary have been varied but always consistent - sincerely and generously given. In 1995 Rex was president of the club, with very short notice. During Rex's year we shifted venue to the Boathouse, we raised \$13000 for Child Health Research, we bagged and sold manure from Peter Dixon's farm, we completed the Founders Railway Station and we grew in numbers from 83 to 87. A great year in anyone's books!

Rex has been a district coordinator of GSE and this year he is one of District Governor Keith's eight Assistant Governors, which entails regular meetings with the area presidents, visiting clubs and ensuring that we are all achieving our goals.
