#### News from the Netherlands Consul



#### European Parliament Election 4 June 2009.

If you are a Dutch national residing outside the Netherlands, then you may vote in elections for the European Parliament on 4 June 2009. However, you must be 18 years of age or older on the day you vote. Furthermore, you must also be eligible to vote.

If you would like to vote for the European Parliament, you are first required to register with the Gemeente Den Haag as a voter residing outside the Netherlands, using form D3-2. You can download this form at http://www.denhaag.nl/smartsite.html?id=50448

The completed form, signed and with proof of Dutch Nationality, can be send to the Consulate General in Chicago, or to: Burgemeester en wethouders van 's-Gravenhage

#### **Dutch Passport Renewal**

As of the end of June 2009, Dutch passport applications will no longer be done in St. Louis. Anyone applying for a passport after June will have to go to Chicago. If you have a passport expiring in the second half of 2009 (or even the first half of 2010), you might want to consider renewing early if you want to avoid a ten-hour round trip by car.
