REVIEW: THE FEBRUARY MEETING

Jeff Alarie from Appleton's Woodcraft gave a great presentation on using the router to make inlays. It was a "watch me on the big screen" presentation, benefitting from the Guild's new technology — mini-cameras and a microphone that enabled Mark Brienen to focus right in on the action. Even Brian Everson, who always sits in the very back row, got a bird's eye view.

Frankly, I was stunned by how simple the techniques for router-based inlays are, particularly with the nifty templates available on the market. I had no clue how one would approach the problem, but Jeff made it simple and straight-forward. Looks like I'll be spending a few bucks on some of that stuff. The gist of the method is that one uses a pattern and a bushing on the router to remove the wood from where the inlay is to go. One then uses the same pattern and a different bushing (or a special attachment that adjusts the size of the original bushing) to cut the inlay from a contrasting piece of wood. Jeff always cuts the inlaid piece just a little thicker than the hole so the inlay can be sanded down flush with the surface.

There are several kits available for those who would like to get the whole inlay package all at once in a box. Alternatively, you can buy sets of bushings to match your router and either buy patterns separately or make them yourself. Kits and bushings are available from our member stores.

If you missed the meeting, Jeff will be doing an encore at the show on Saturday.
