GHP Allocution,
Companions,

The time has come, as it must for each of us, to move on. It has been a “Grand Honor” indeed, to have served you for the past two years as your Grand High Priest. To have this opportunity to advance ideas gathered from you and other Jurisdictions has been my Distinct Honor and a great privilege to perform on your behalf.

During the past two years I have attended twenty-two Grand Royal Arch Convocations; two North East Regional Conferences of Grand York Rite Bodies; General Grand Chapter RAM International, Triennial Conclave; Supreme Council AASR, NMJ, twice and the York Rite Sovereign College. These gatherings are much more than a “Party Time” event. Ideas are discussed, problems dissected, solutions offered and yes, there is the “FUN” aspect during the events when we all socialize with our Ladies.

Within New Hampshire I have visited every Chapter at least four times and have been present for every Annual Visitation. Several opportunities arose where I was invited to participate in the degree work, which I did happily. The many occasions at which I represented our Grand Chapter at other Masonic functions such as Lodge, Council, Commandery, Scottish Rite, Rainbow and all of the York Rite Appendant Bodies attached in New Hampshire are too numerous to list here. They are on the copy of my schedule previously submitted. Unfortunately it was necessary to send regrets this past year to the following Jurisdictions in Canada and the U. S:

Nova Scotia; Newfoundland; Ontario; Quebec; New Brunswick; O. E. S; Shrine; Massachusetts; Indiana; Virginia; Maryland; Delaware; New Jersey and Washington, DC.

A perspective upon The State of the Craft:

Our problems are NOT unique to us! Indeed, all of our Fraternity is suffering from a set of problems that we share. There are those aspects which come down to the personal level but the overwhelming majority of them fall into the Membership category such as; replacing those who are called to present their work before the Supreme Architect; those of Demits and Non-payment of dues. There is also and in my opinion a deeper aspect, that of Quality. You are aware perhaps, that water seeks its own level, so do people! If perhaps you think that you are a fine example of manhood, you will seek out another whom you think closely represents your example to replace yourself. If you are truly as good a man as you think of yourself, all will be well. Look within, be honest in your self-inventory, stand tall and make those changes by which you may become a better man. Remember that you are replacing yourself! If you are truly as good a man as you think of yourself, all will be well. If your ego is in the way, there is a problem! My Brethren, **THE HEART AND SOUL OF OUR FRATERNITY IS SELF - DETERMINATION!**

We have frequently discussed methods and programs to present too your Masonic Bodies concerning individual challenges of Leadership and Responsibility. You should plan to attend the Leadership Conferences; listen to the ideas, thoughts, programs and indeed even solutions to at least one, but more than likely, several of your "Problems". Perhaps you say, " Oh, let someone else go; these things are all the same; he can report on what to do; he has more time than me or even in my opinion the worst excuse,"

"I don't need it!" Let me say this to you; if you are "in charge" or soon will be and you do NOT see any problems with your organization, then perhaps, just perhaps, YOU should give instruction to the rest of us who DO see problems? Are there solutions? Of course there are. However, they do require your participation. You are the one who can and must make the difference. This effort can only come from your desire to see our Fraternity not only survive but to prosper.

Begin by bringing just one new Brother into your Lodge. Work with him as he goes through the degrees, act as his Mentor, assist him in gaining understanding as well as giving him your support. If you represent the Pillars of Wisdom and Strength: a Brother he can depend upon, he will soon observe the Pillar of Beauty that adorns our Fraternity. You will surprise yourself as well! The effort, not really great, will also reawaken your own knowledge and build your self-confidence. Soon you will rediscover abilities that have been there, lying dormant, all along and you will find yourself looking for another Candidate. Meanwhile, the Brother you have worked so diligently with asks you about "Additional Light". Why? It may be he has noticed that on certain nights you had other Masonic functions to attend? Of course you have been planting the seeds of curiosity all along and understand that, sooner or later, the question (s) will come. A properly groomed and educated Brother will want "more" and will eventually thirst for it. It will be up to you to assist him. **DO NOT PUSH!**

There are many paths to travel in Freemasonry. Each path is strewn with obstacles, the going can be rough and rugged and you may even lose your way at times, do not despair or give in! There is a path to success. The working tools of a Master Mason are there for your use! That, which is worth having or cherishing, is never free of cost.

The initiate is curious; if you have properly prepared the individual; if you have gained his trust during your mentoring period, he will ask! It may be that the question will come sooner rather than later, just be available for his benefit, (not yours) and continue as before, it will happen. There is an old adage in sales; after you have presented your prospect with the facts; explained the "benefits"; answered all of the questions, it is time to shut up.

Would you make this even easier? The secret is, "more than one Candidate working together at the same time!" They will ask questions! You can utilize this opportunity by steering them to the answers. If you do not know, volunteer to assist them in researching the answer. Notice I did not say to give them the answer, but to steer or guide them to it. The process of searching for an answer will be all the more valuable because they will have had to "work for it". The memory of an individual will retain more of what he learns if it is repeated at least three times. This may be accomplished with "homework", "instruction", "reading", "memory work" as well as "personal example". Remember; that Good example, personal or otherwise is never out of place! Do not overburden; Take small steps, one line or a short paragraph at a time, until he is comfortable with them. Let him behold his newfound abilities. Praise in Public, if you must correct in public, do it constructively, Chastise in Private!

There are occasions when you have an aggressive student, let him run; soon he will slow down on his own. Of course, you have been cautioning him that there is much more to these words and phrases; investigate them. What do they mean to him and even others? “PRUDENCE” coupled with wisdom and guidance is crucial at this point. He may at this time, feel like he has taken on too much. Sort of like overeating, it becomes difficult to chew and swallow. REMEMBER, “PATIENCE”! Sometimes it is three steps forward and two steps back, but you have gained that crucial step and you must both preserve it and persevere with FORTITUDE!

Do you remember the impatient days of youth? When you wanted to do things for yourself? When your instruction reaches that point, turn loose of your student. UNLESS YOU ARE ASKED, DO NOT INTERFER! We must each make our own mistakes; it is a fact of life! To bad we do not learn from the pages of history or by the mistakes of others often enough! Life would probably be easier, if not a bit boring. Do not fear mistakes, it is a learning process we must face individually. Give me the person who is willing to challenge the unknown and learn from mistakes, that person will progress in life far beyond those who seek the comfort zone of complacency.

What do we do about Non Payment of Dues and Demits? Unfortunately they are in part our fault. WHY? Simply put, Lack of Communication! Have you heard excuses like I do not want to overburden the Secretary? Well then, you can visit the Brother and Companion concerned. He lives in some far away place or out of state you say! The phone sure cuts distance down, or at least send a “Thinking of You” note! Does your Masonic Body have a “Trestle Board”? If so use it, if not, WHY NOT?

My “Mother Lodge” Steadfast # 216 is in Bremerton, Washington. While in the Navy, I received “Trestleboards” from them (whenever my mail caught up to my ship) for years. What was the result? Living as I do in New Hampshire, it is very unlikely I will ever attend another meeting there. I became a Life Member. But why did I? It is because I did not want to lose that contact which is alive even today after over 42 years. I could just as easily Demitted, but I chose to remain a member because they kept faith with me for years! Have you kept faith with your members?

There are other excuses that some can and will use but that is just what they are, excuses! I can’t write, I misspell, I don’t know what to say or I don’t have the time are just a few of the more typical excuses. There is always someone who is able; it is up to you as a “Leader” to convince him. Paragraphs from each Officer will soon fill a letter. When a Brother cannot be present, any news is more than what they have. Introduce your Officers one or two at a time with a write up. Describe their Masonic history, other

members as well, who are, perhaps, active in other branches of the Fraternity. Did one of your members receive an Honor or Award? Where? When? Why? Do not keep it to yourself, let others in on your “secret”! There is a lot to talk about; report what has, is or about to happen!

This presentation is an example. Do you think I had it all planned out? If so, you give me far too much credit. This is the product of several days of typing (with two fingers). The spell checker works well and the program assists me in words and phrases. Then comes the proof reading, changes in emphasis or clarity, more time. If it is worth doing, do it well, to the best of your ability. We are generally, all in the same boat, take your time, and work out the kinks. If someone else thinks they can do better, encourage them then, to do so. Do not shy away from “Constructive Criticism”, do not let “Your Ego” or “Vanity” get in the way! Ask for bits of information from others as they travel on vacation or to visit another Masonic body. Be honest in what you report but remember to keep it “Brotherly”. **START NOW!**

Bring these ideas to the other Masonic Bodies that you attend. Present them and discuss these approaches. Put your oar into the water and cause others too as well. With only “your” oar in the water, you will have great difficulty avoiding moving in a circle, it can be done but you must take care and learn the proper techniques!

Recommendations for New and Old Officers alike:

1. Form a fund raising committee and utilize it to have fun, learn to work as a team and you will be able to eventually work your way out of this present state of inactivity, the Doldrums of life.
2. Form the Appointed Officers of the line into a group that plans for the time when each of them, God willing, may succeed to the Oriental Chair. They will have common goals and a common strategy to accomplish them. The first mentioned committee would be a great place to cut their teeth and learn to work together for the future of the Fraternity, no less depends on your efforts.
3. It is late in the game for the “PAST” officers to do this, however, your knowledge and advise may be just the right touch needed, it would be beneficial all the same, start planning for the future together, NOW. Give the junior officers a chance to demonstrate their abilities. All of you have asked at one time or another, “What is my job?” Simply stated, “Your job

4. is to learn to work as a TEAM!" Today, the lack of teamwork limits our ability to properly function as a Unit. It is NOT about you or me but about US! No person, however talented, has ALL of the answers. When you run across an individual who "is always correct" and they do exist, use caution but stick to your plan. Every plan can and will go wrong at one point or another. Every plan will have rough spots, or be out of adjustment. If you have faith in the plan then "tweak it, don't kill it".
5. Establish a method to pay for the FUTURE! Involve your corresponding officers in the other Masonic Bodies, especially if you are operating in a Temple with other Masonic Bodies. Are they permitted to participate by their respective Presiding Officer? I found this question hard to believe, however I have witnessed it too many times to say it is an isolated incident. Perhaps it is the belief that the "Rites" are taking away members from them? If they are, then let each Organization read the above and look too their own short comings and fix them! Use your own initiative by setting an example (it is termed "LEADERSHIP"). There is a stark reality, that is "success breeds imitation".
6. Work together as a TEAM! We have, over many years, dug ourselves into a deep pit. Fortunately we still have our tools with us. It is time to dig our way out of this pit, into the light of progress. There are no others to do the job; you are "IT!" The time to start is NOW! If you do not bail the water out of the boat, it will sink. No "LEADER" can do it alone, TEAMWORK is the KEY to SURVIVAL and everything depends on it.

There are two other "sayings" I would like you to think about.

"The speed of the Leader is the speed of the PACK". What happens when the "Leader" out runs the pack? What happens when the "Leader" fails to LEAD? What happens to the "TEAM"?

ANYBODY can eat an elephant, HOW? One bite at a time!

Reach out and touch somebody's hand!

The Jurisprudence Committee submits the following report for your information and knowledge.

The Committee commends the three (3) Grand Heads for their work in helping the North Country in the working out of their various by-lay and location problems (Littleton, Lancaster and Colebrook) with proper guidance and the necessary changes and approvals, of their bodies meeting jointly in the three different locations.

The Committee commends the Grand High Priest for his travels within/without the state.

The committee thanks him for providing his Annual Report in a timely manner. This allowed the committee to peruse each element and render our decisions and comments to this Grand Royal Arch Chapter.

We approved his dispensation for New Hampshire Chapters to take candidates to Maine to receive the Royal Arch Degree. However, we do not approve of his rendering a dispensation for Trinity Chapter #2, Concord, NH to suspend its STATED CONVOCATION to another night. Stated Convocations are set by the provisions of authoritative Bylaws and cannot be changed or suspended by anyone. Bylaws are written to govern, not to be abandoned on convenient occasions.

Jurisprudence was not privy to any recommendations and/or approvals of Grand Representatives to or from other Grand Jurisdictions or the choice of medal (Grand Chapter or General Grand Chapter) recipients which is part of the Grand High Priest's Annual Report.

We, did not and still do not approve of the change in the Visitation Structure. The three dais Officers, as well as the Grand Captain of the Host, as ELECTED OFFICERS have, always shared the responsibility of insuring that the works, both governmental and ritualistically, are performed in accordance with the Grand Chapter Regulations. We recommend that this form of Visitation Structure cease and the original format returned with this coming year.

It is our opinion that the Grand High Priest's "recommendations" are purely personal observation and not recommendations at all, and cannot be acted upon as such.

We agree with the Doings of Grand Officers Committee that the Grand Officers need to be more concerned with presenting their Reports at the Business Convocation as requested by the Grand High Priest. This matter is not appropriate and should not continue. If the Grand Officers are required to make a report, then they should.
