When I wrote above mentioned article on June 23<sup>rd</sup> '06, I mentioned that this would be a “balanced” race with long enders and fanciers on the short end having an equal chance. I never thought that my loft would end up being the victorious one. My hen 2000 CU TF 0471 (named: Kina!!) covered the 910 km in 12 hours and 7 minutes. She is a very intelligent hen bred out of my Hamilton Classic winner 96 CU NRBC 966801 and a full sister to Daddy Longlac . The first couple of years she was strictly a short distance pigeon scoring many times on these distances. As a 2 year old she was sent to Gogama-Matheson-S.R. Falls-Cochrane and L.Lac. She did extremely well on all these distances but was deleted a few times on account of the dumb 5 bird limit rule (I know I am beating a dead horse but I strongly feel that on long distance races there should be no limit in the clocking. Why don't we change the limit from 20 to 10 and have unlimited clocking.)

Later on she flew Hearst-Moosonee-L.Lac. Always returning in good condition. This time she was sent to Nakina as a widowhood hen and beat the lot.

Good for her and her boss.

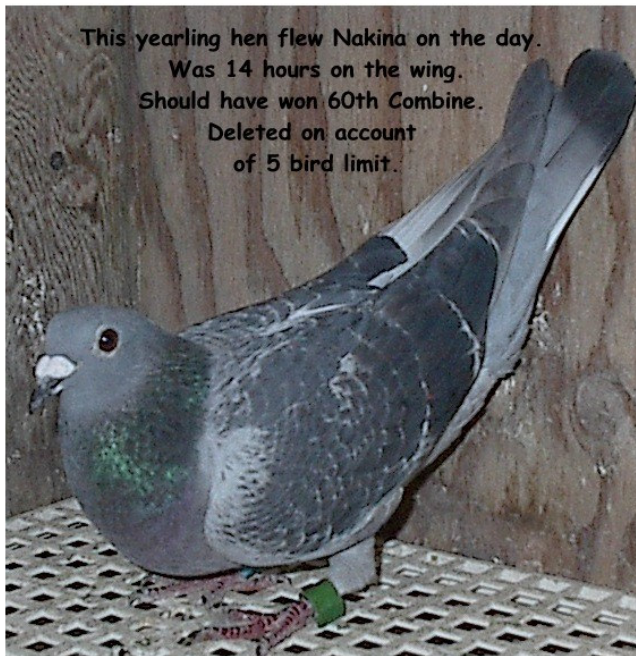
