

Anointing Oils

The usage of Anointing Oils has been widely spread throughout the World now and in past ages, and has always been symbolic of some form of sacred work or ritual. amongst the Jews and early Christian Sects this was a common practice usually associated with illness or healing work or in relation to some form of religious ordinance. In the Middle East the oil was usually made up from Palm Oil, Olive Oil, Sandalwood Oil and Cedarwood Oil, and some say these four oils were used to suggest it was in relation to the Four Archangels Michael, Thuriel, Gabriel and Uriel and that when one had mixed the oils together they then prayed to the four points, being North, East, South, West

Whatever the reason for this strange ritual will probably never be known in this life, however, the important thing was that the Priest or Head Manan would hold the Oil in the palms of the hands and pray that God's living force would enter into this Oil sanctifying it and blessing it. In most cases the forehead would be anointed with the Oil during some ritual or the head would be dabbed then the heart area, then the right hand and finally the right foot. While this action was taking place the anointer would pray that the anointee would always think of God in all things, (head) Love God and all his commandments, (heart) always let their right hand do God's work and fight on His behalf, (hand) and always allow his footsteps to walk in righteousness (foot) and to take the right hand path.. There are many variations of this story recorded and a variety of reasons for anointing and the author will often use Oil as an anointing agent to terminally ill people that seek healing and in most forms of Spiritual Healing. There is provably a sound scientific reason for anointing where healing is required and one of these may be, that the Oil when placed on the anointee holds some special energy or healing force while it is present on the skin. Nowadays it is dismissed by skeptics and many other religious groups, even though it is often referred to in the Bible, All I can say is don't rubbish it until you have tried it for yourself. When blessing Oil for his own use, the author simply holds a small bottleful in the hands and prays over it asking for the Light of Christ to enter into this liquid so that it may be used in conjunction with prayer to ease the burdens from the sick and dying.

Unscientific tests have been made on oil by dowsers who can pick the bottle with the special life giving force in it, every time. Take two or three small containers with Oil in them and have one blessed under the method suggested, then get the Dowser to pick out the special one, a rough test maybe, but it does indicate that there is some extra special power in one lot that is not present in the others.

Finally on this matter, the author believes that any Oil can be used and blessed for such purposes, and he himself has indeed just used plain Olive Oil for many years for this work and feels that in the main there is a transmission of the anointers own body energies that is impregnated into the liquid, a sort of Green Thumb effect that many good gardeners seem to possess and it is this energy once combined with the prayer, which gathers the spirit forces, that can bring about healing and even relieve pain.
