Quiz Fact Sheet

This year's Quiz rally will be held once again at Teikyo Post University in Waterbury, CT on Sunday, April 7. There is no snow date, so pray for good weather! It will be conducted in accordance with the USPC HANDBOOK AND RULES FOR QUIZ COMPETITION 2002. The Quiz may consist of classroom, barn, stations, Mega-Room and written test.

ENTRY FEE: \$10 per competitor. \$5 per incomplete competitor if accepted. Refunds at 50% with medical excuse for Pony Clubber.

**OPENING & CLOSING DATES: Registration Opens March 4, 2002 and closes March 19, 2002**

**Entries must be in the Organizer's possession by the closing date.**

**Late entries will not be accepted.**

**The fee for incomplete entries will be \$5 per competitor.**

**DIVISIONS:** Members will participate in divisions according to rating (current) and age (as of Jan 1) as follows in teams of three or four members. The organizer will try and place individuals on a team on a space available basis. Due to space constraints, we must limit participation to those who are at least ten years of age as of Jan. 1 2002. No D may compete on a C team and no C may compete on a D team. Each team entered will designate one member as a Captain by putting an \* in front of their name on the team entry form. The organizer will chose one if no one is designated or a scramble team. Entry fee is \$10 per member. Entries are limited and will be registered in FIRST-COME-FIRST SERVED BASIS in order of date of receipt of complete entries with priority given to those with intent to attend Nationals. **National competitors must be 10 or older and rated D2 or above by the closing date of the rally.**

Junior D& Unrated-12 years of age or less  
Senior D& Unrated-13 years of age and up  
Junior C/B-14 years of age or less  
Senior C/B 15 years of age & up  
B/H/H-A/A-2 members any age

**DIRECTIONS:** From RT. 84 west of Waterbury Interchange of Rt. 8/84 take Exit 17. Follow Rt. 63 South to a light at Country Club Rd. Turn left up Country Club Rd. Follow to top of hill and enter parking lot at North Gate. Quiz will be in North Hall, which is the first building on the left as you leave the parking lot walking towards the campus.

**STARTING TIME:** The grounds will open at 7:30. Registration is available at that time. Briefing of Volunteers 8 am. Briefing of Competitors 8:15. Please arrive promptly and register, we plan to start promptly. No study materials will be allowed into the competition area for contestants. Please leave materials in car.

**FOOD:** Will not be available. Please bring a bag lunch that will be eaten in a quiz room. You may bring a dessert or snack to share.

**CHAPERONE:** A chaperone is needed for every team or for every 4 scramble participants from a club. Chaperones must be 21 or older and read sign and return the enclosed chaperone duties form. A chaperone must be available if needed for their team so may not be a volunteer in a position they can not leave at any time.

**VOLUNTEERS:** We can not run this event without your help! We need a minimum of 1 volunteer per every 4 scramble members or team. Extra volunteers are welcome. As a spectator, room may be limited. A volunteer position guarantees you a great view of the proceedings! Very helpful to bring Quiz rulebook for your reference for many volunteer jobs. Job preferences will try to be accommodated if possible. We will try and post jobs on the NY/UC e-mail list for your reference. **AWARDS:** Ribbons for teams to 6<sup>th</sup> place in each division. C and above teams may be combined into one division for awards purposes if entries warrant. An overall high point team perpetual trophy will be awarded.

**CHAMPIONSHIPS:** *National competitors must be 10 or older as of Jan 1, 2002 and rated D2 or above by the closing date of the rally.*

Please also make note of your intent on your entry form. Parents or legal guardian must be present at end of rally to plan for team, chaperone and practice, pay entry, fill out entry forms if available and give credit card number to Barbara Kil to secure room at Championships. Any exceptions, must contact RS Barbara Kil.**

**INFORMATION ABOUT QUIZ NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS:** The RS selects the regional representatives for all championships according to NY/UC policy and national guidelines for competitors. This year will be held at Lexington, VA from Aug 1-4. For each division, the four-team members, and one chaperone are designated. The chaperone is an unpaid volunteer. Parents are welcome, but the team usually stays together in one room with the chaperone. Alternates are picked and must study and keep the dates open in case an opening appears. Each team member is responsible for his/her own expenses. Some clubs help defray the cost. Here is a very rough estimate: Entry fee-\$140, Lodging-\$125(1/4 room & 1/4 chaperone's room x 4 nights), Regional shirt-\$16, MEALS & Snacks-\$100, Transportation-flight or car \$? Spending money? Team members are required to wear Pony Club pins and regional shirts and usually khaki pants, skirts or acceptable khaki shorts. Appropriate footwear for the barn is also required(usually paddock boots). This is general information and may change to some degree.
