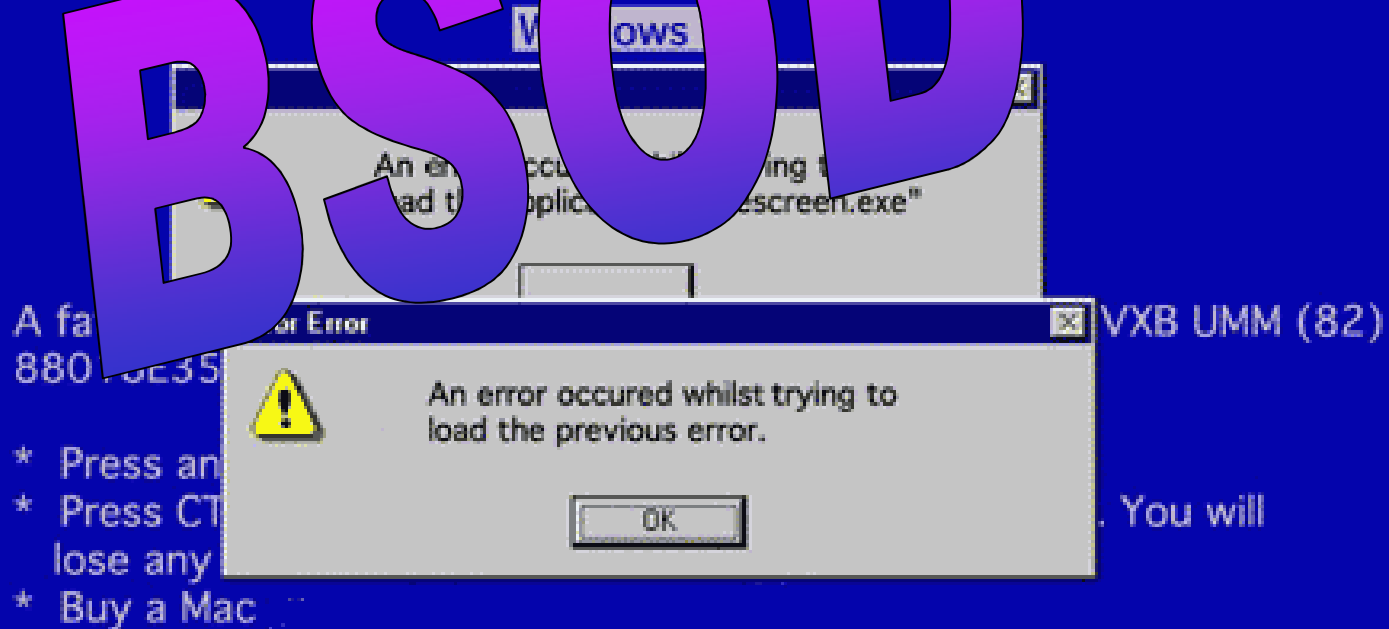

# Nine Tips for Teaching

## Tip #1

- Instruct in Small Doses
  - Focus on one correction at a time
  - Try to relate to the age of your student
  - Re-emphasize any previous material learned when teaching new material



# Nine Tips for Teaching

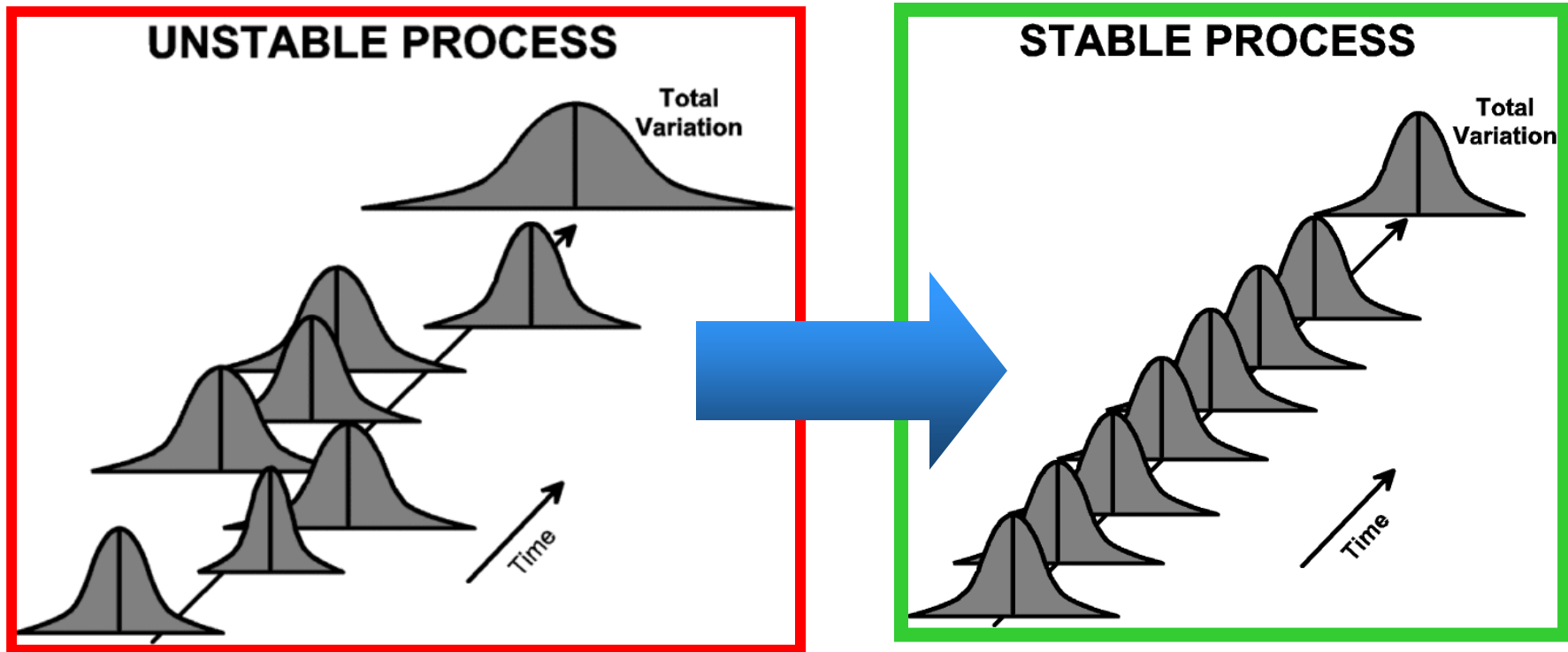
## Tip #2

- Use a variety of approaches for instruction
  - Visual (Seeing)
  - Auditory (Hearing)
  - Kinesthetic (Doing)

## Tip #3



- Stay Consistent
  - Repeat previously learned material

## Tip #4

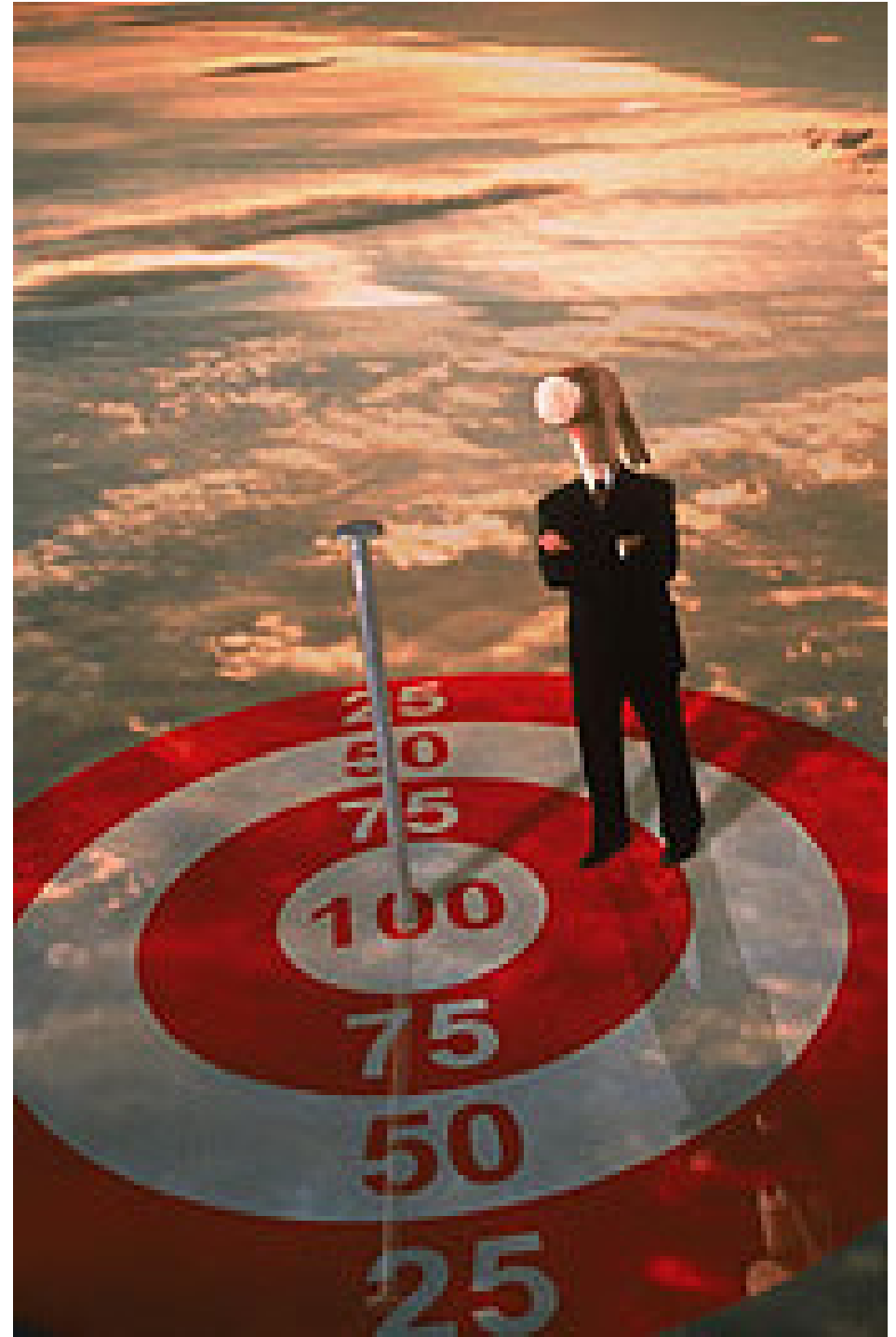
- Model the manners you want your students to exhibit
  - Respect
  - Courtesy
  - Confidence



# Nine Tips for Teaching

## Tip #5

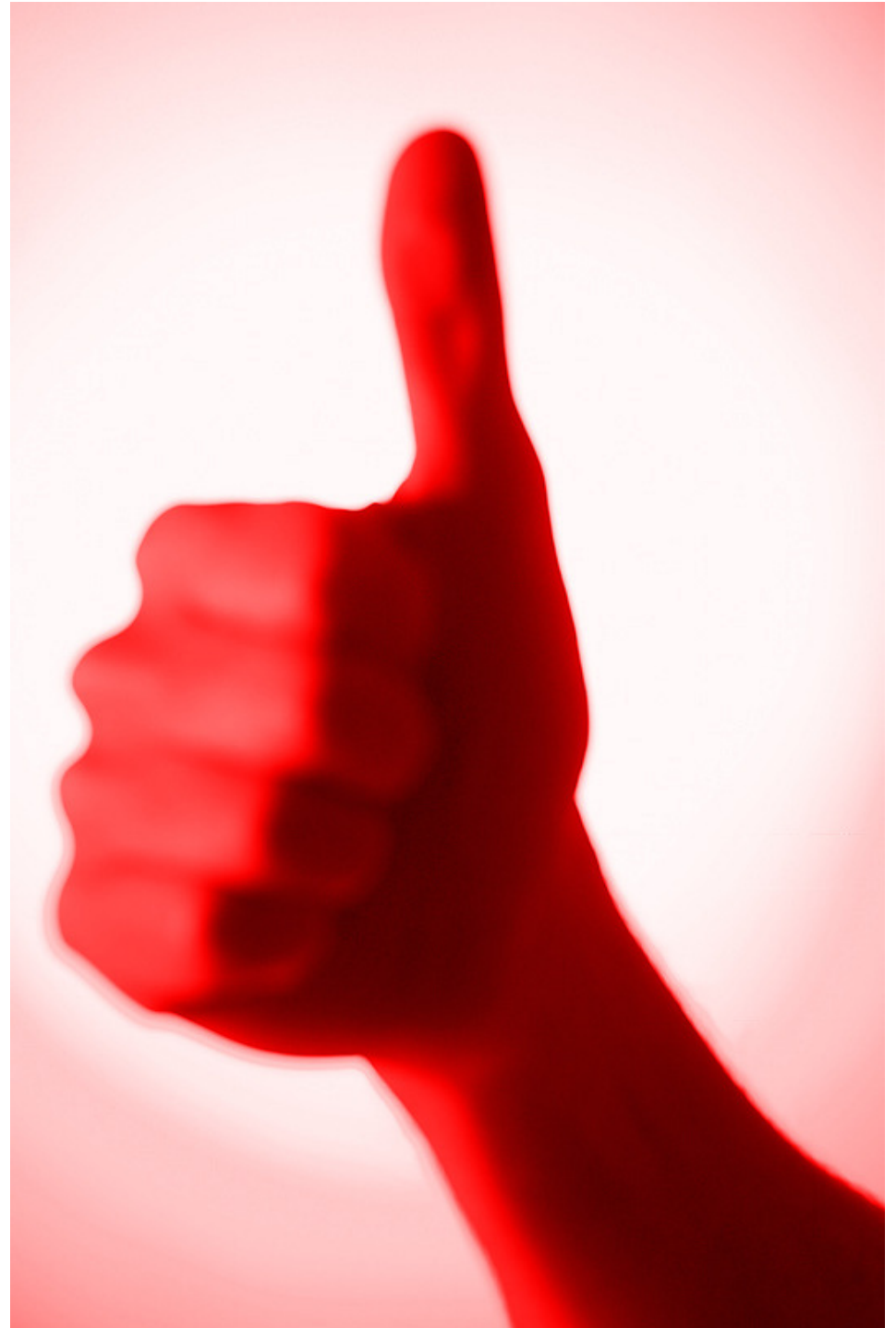
- Tell your students what you expect
  - Attention
  - Focus
  - Commitment

- Compliment your students
  - Thumbs up
  - High Five
  - Have student demonstrate their good technique for the class

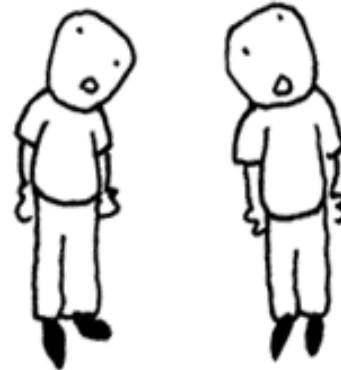

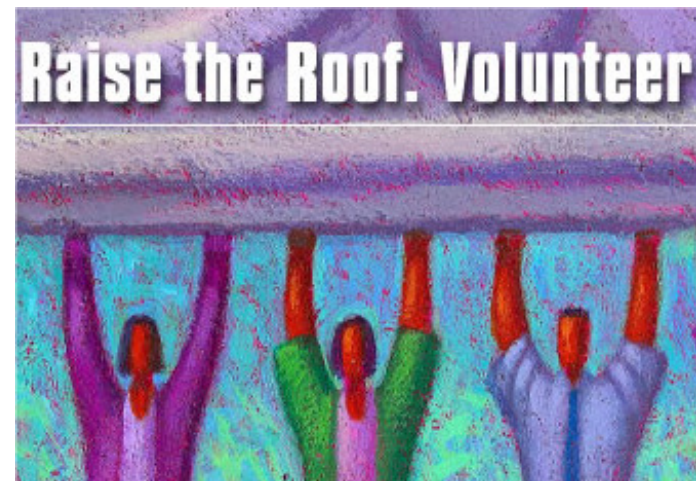

*Failing is the path of least persistence*

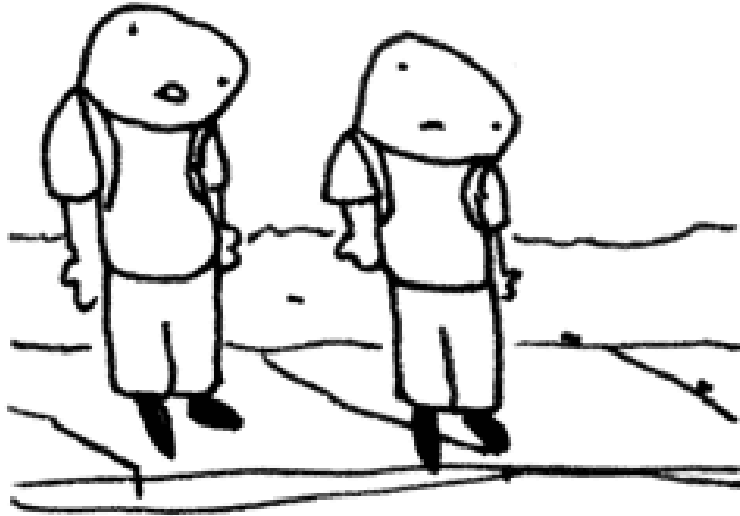

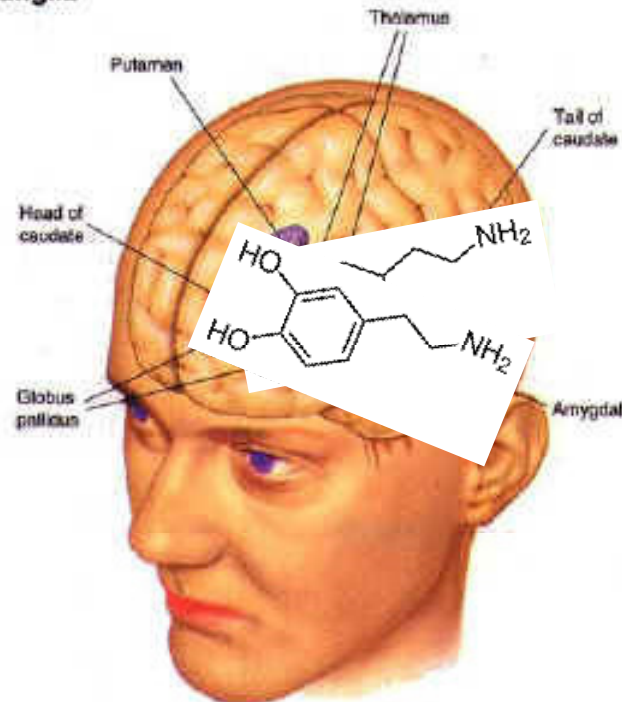
