PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Folks,

Our community is still in shock over the situations involving two students from the Clarence High School who are thought to have been involved in the murder of an Amherst woman. These students along with three other people are involved in the alleged murder. The poor woman who suffered as a result of the plotting and planning is not allegedly dead but she is certainly truly dead.

This tragic occurrence should alert parents to the potential evil that is lurking in our community. There are adults that will entice your children for money, drugs, sex or whatever, to do things that they know are wrong but they have become desensitized and manipulated into doing them. Back in September I asked our ninth grade Religious Education Classes if they were ever approached by someone offering or selling drugs. You might have been shocked at their answers. They all knew someone who was on drugs or distributed drugs.

If your children were friends or acquaintances of any of the alleged students who were arrested, make sure that you talk to them about it. You might also want to involve a professional counselor or guidance counselor. Teenagers are often rebellious and restless but when teenagers begin to develop antisocial behavior and lack a sense of moral responsibility this should be a red flag for parents. They need help now. There is an old saying: "Tell me who your friends are and I'll tell

you what kind of a person you are.” Your own life can be tainted by association. We live our lives in a network of relationships and when something bad or evil happens it affects everyone who is close to you.

From the experience I have gained as serving as a New York State Prison Chaplain I often wonder how many inmates could have been spared the life of imprisonment if someone was there for them to help and guide them. Too many of these inmates exhibited sociopathic behavior before their life of crime and many have turned into true sociopaths.

You cannot bury your head in the sand. Be alert to what your children are doing and where they are going. When they ride their bikes and congregate at the town parks and other places you should be taking out your bikes and riding through the places they congregate just to let them know you are around and you know where they are.

I encourage young people to be alert to dangerous situations they may happen upon or know about. Tell your parents, a teacher, report everything that looks suspicious and notify legal authorities. Summer is a wonderful time to enjoy the great outdoors but remember to play it safe and keep it safe.
