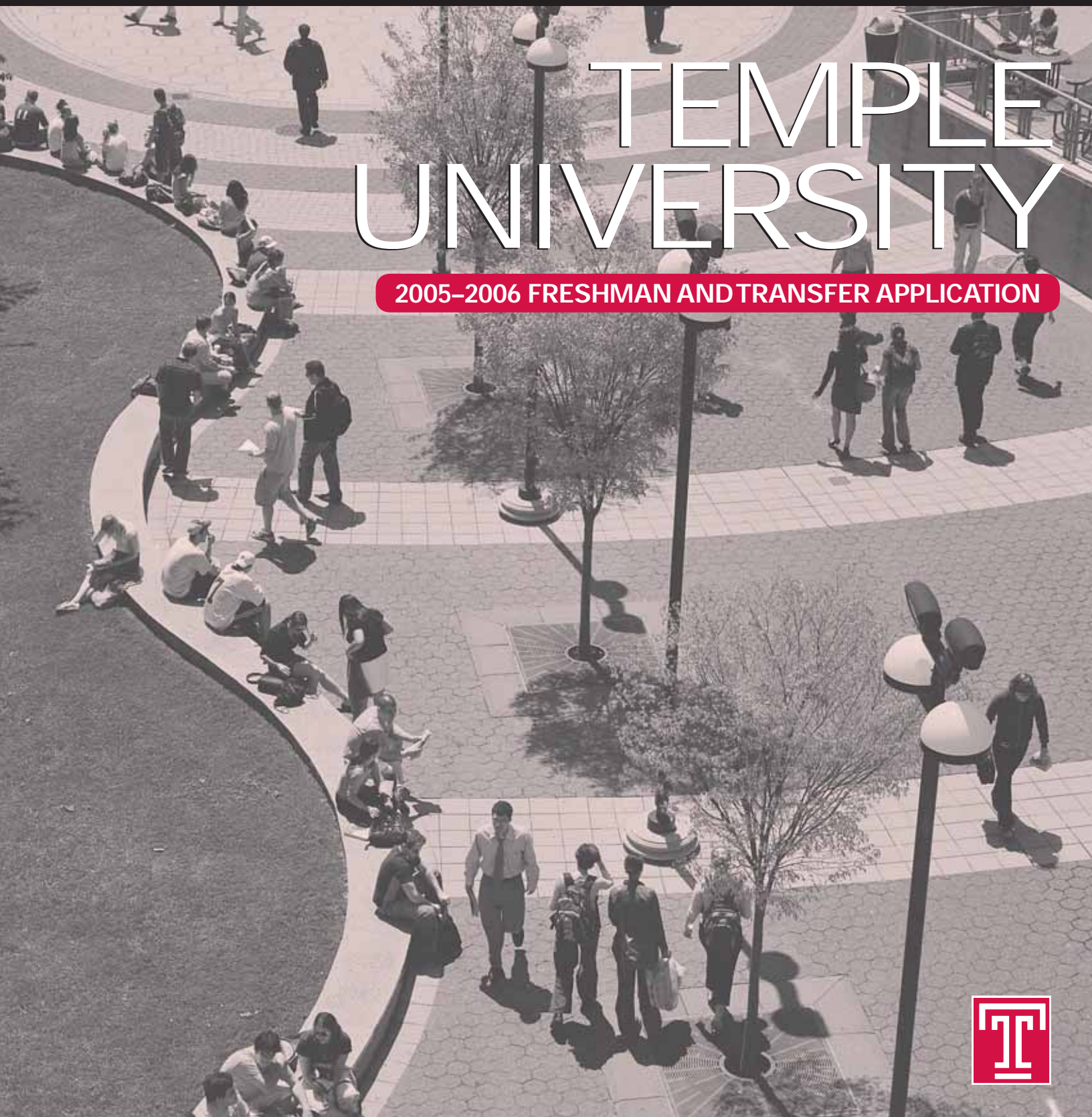

Applying to Temple University

We are pleased that you are applying to Temple. The information on this page and the instructions on page C will help you complete the application accurately, so please read them carefully.

Application Deadlines

Fall Semester: April 1 for freshmen (March 1 for Music freshmen); June 1 for transfers (March 1 for Nursing transfers, May 1 for Music transfers). **Spring Semester:** November 1 for all students.

A few reminders:

- > Enclose a check or money order (no cash) for \$35 made payable to Temple University.
- > Submit only official transcripts – those mailed directly to the Admissions Office from the records office at a school, college, or agency.
- > Remember to sign and date your application.
- > You may apply online at www.temple.edu/undergrad

You Should Complete This Application...

- > If you are applying to Temple for the first time as either a freshman or transfer student.
- > If you previously applied to Temple more than one year ago. If so, you also must have new official transcripts sent to us.

You Should Not Complete This Application...

- > If you have applied to Temple within the last year but did not attend. Complete instead a **Renewal Application**, available from the Admissions Office or online at www.temple.edu.
- > If you previously attended Temple as a degree candidate (matriculated student). Complete instead a **Readmission Application**, available from the Dean's Office of the College or School in which you were last enrolled.
- > If you have already earned a bachelor's degree and wish to take courses as a non-matriculant or wish to obtain certification from one of our schools or colleges. Complete instead a **Special Student Application**, available from the Dean's Office of the College in which you wish to enroll; or contact the Office of Continuing Education (215-204-2500).
- > If you are an international student. If you are not a U.S. citizen and will require a non-immigrant visa, you must complete the **International Student Application**, available from the Admissions Office or online at www.temple.edu.

Freshman Applicants

You are considered a freshman applicant if you are still in high school or have taken fewer than 15 credits at an accredited college or university after graduating from high school or earning a GED.

- > If you are still in high school, submit your completed application, \$35 application fee, and the attached envelope to your guidance counselor, who should enclose your official high school transcript and SAT/ACT scores and send it to the Admissions Office.

- > If you have completed high school or have earned a GED, send your application and fee to us directly and request all high schools and colleges you have attended to mail us an official copy of your transcripts. If you did not graduate from high school but have earned a state General Equivalency Diploma (GED), submit your original GED scores as well as all transcripts of course work completed before leaving high school. If you are 22 years of age or older, we consider you an adult student and do not require you to submit SAT/ACT scores.

Transfer Applicants

You are a transfer applicant if you have taken 15 or more credits at an accredited college or university after graduating from high school or earning a GED. You must authorize all high schools and colleges you attended to send official copies of your transcripts to Temple's Admissions Office. Return your completed application and fee directly to the Admissions Office.

The Decision Process

We can make an admission decision only when your application is complete, which is when we have received all required documentation, including your signed application, \$35 fee, all high school and college transcripts, and SAT/ACT/GED/TOEFL scores if applicable. We may initially review a completed application and request additional information, such as senior grades or later test results before making a final decision.

We make decisions on a rolling basis beginning in November for both Spring and Fall admission. We usually notify applicants within a month of their submitting a completed application, although we hold some applications until early April. All decisions are made by professional admissions staff members, who take into consideration all high school and college grades, class rank, standardized test scores, essays, recommendations, and other relevant information.

Track Your Application Status

Shortly after you apply, you will receive an AccessNet username and Personal Identification Number (PIN) that will enable you to use the Internet to track the status of your application through the decision-making process. You will learn whether your application is complete or incomplete, what documents or materials are missing, and whether an admissions decision has been made and mailed to you.

When you receive your AccessNet username and PIN, instructions will be included to activate your AccessNet account and assign yourself a permanent password. After activating your account, go to the TUportal Web site at <http://tuportal.temple.edu> and log in with your AccessNet username and password. Then click on "OWLnet" and enter your password again.

After logging into OWLnet, click on "Undergraduate Applicants" to follow your application through the process. Please use your AccessNet username and password to access this information before calling or e-mailing us. Specific Instructions for Completing the Application

The following instructions correspond with the numbered questions on the application.

- 1-8** Complete the biographical information as it pertains to you. If your name has changed since you attended high school and/or college, give both your current and former names on **Q.1**. Answering **Q.8** is voluntary and will not affect consideration of your application. The information is used solely for compliance with civil rights laws.
- 9** If you are not a U.S. citizen, provide your alien registration number and a copy of your alien registration card. If you are an international student, you must complete an International Student Application available from the Admissions Office.
- 10** If you claim Pennsylvania as your legal residence, note the number of years that both you and your parents have lived continuously in the state. If less than one year, indicate number of months. The Admissions Office makes the initial decision about residency based on the applicant's current state of residence and schools/colleges attended. Our Registrar's Office resolves all residency appeals. Members of the Armed Forces on active duty in Pennsylvania (and their dependents) are classified as residents for tuition purposes.
- 11** Check "live on campus" if you intend to live in a residence hall on campus; check "commute" if you intend to live at home during the school year or if you have made other off-campus living arrangements.
- 12** On the School/College curriculum code sheet (page d) the University's schools and colleges are listed in red type with a code number and their academic programs listed in black type.
- 12a** Locate your intended major and list the School or College and the code number.
- 12b** List your intended major. If you are undecided about a major at this time, as many students are, select the 073 Undeclared code. Or, you may indicate "undecided" in either the Schools of Business and Management (Fox), Tourism and Hospitality Management, or Communications and Theater, or in the Colleges of Engineering, Liberal Arts or Science and Technology.
Note: Students transferring 60 or more credits must select a specific major (not undeclared).
