

Here's a **step-by-step guide** on **how to link one HTML page to another**, including how to write, save, and run it.

□ **Goal:**

You'll create **two HTML files**:

- `home.html` (the main page)
- `about.html` (the linked page)

Clicking a link on `home.html` will open `about.html`.

🔗 **Step 1: Create a Project Folder**

1. Create a new folder on your computer called `mywebsite`.
Example:
`Desktop\mywebsite`

🔗 **Step 2: Create the First HTML Page (home.html)**

1. Open **Notepad** (or any code editor like VS Code).
2. Type this code in notepad++:

```
<!DOCTYPE html>

<html>

<head>

  <title>Home Page</title>

</head>

<body>


  <h1>Welcome to My Website</h1>

  <p><a href="about.html">Go to About Page</a></p>

</body>
```

</html>

Note:-

- Click **File > Save As...**
 - Name it: `home.html`
 - Save it in your `mywebsite` folder.
- Make sure the file type is **All Files**

Step 3: Create the Second HTML Page (about.html)

1. Open a new Notepad window.
2. Type this code:

<!DOCTYPE html>

<html>

```
<head>
  <title>About Page</title>
</head>
<body>
  <h1>About This Site</h1>
  <p>This is the about page.</p>
  <p><a href="home.html">Back to Home</a></p>
</body>
</html>
```

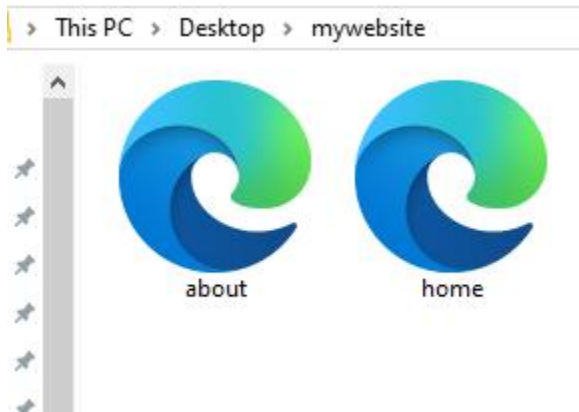

Save it as `about.html` in the **same folder inside** mywebsite.

Then your folder structure will be like this as shown below :-



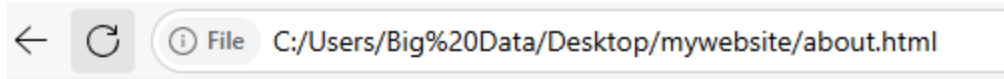
❓ Step 4: Run the Website

1. Go to the folder `mywebsite`.
2. **Double-click** `home.html`.
3. It opens in your web browser as shown in below



4. Click the **“Go to About Page”** link.
 - It takes you to `about.html`.
