

IMF Archive Processor (IMFAP)

Do you use Exchange 2003? Do you get spam or unsolicited commercial email (UCE)? Do you use Microsoft's Exchange 2003 Intelligent Message Filter (IMF)? If you answered yes to all three questions, then IMF Archive Processor (IMFAP) is the product that can help you manage your spam better! IMFAP is not a spam filter, but a processor of archived, potential spam. Let's face it, none of us want to miss an important email, but many spam engines like IMF gobble them up. Nor do we want to wade through endless spam to find the important emails. IMFAP gives you the ability to white list email from those senders you want, by email address or keywords/phrases in the subject or body. IMFAP gives you the ability to get rid of the email that IMF archived, so you never have to look at it. IMFAP can deliver or delete most emails archived by IMF, so you don't have to review them. If IMFAP can't figure out what to do based upon configurable rules, then you can review those emails at your convenience. IMFAP comes with its own Archive Manager, which is for reviewing email processed by IMFAP, but was not delivered or deleted. IMFAP is totally configurable and has many ways to help you delete spam and keep only those few, potentially good emails that remain after the rest are deleted or white listed. No tool or method to combat spam is perfect at eliminating spam and not eliminating good email. IMFAP is a very useful tool, which has achieved 97%+ rules based success on average during a multi-year case study in a real world environment. IMFAP runs and is administered on any Exchange 2003 server with IMF installed. Typically, IMFAP would reside on a Front-End Exchange server, but it does not have to.
