Contributions from Detachment members

Marine Keith Sheldon documented the following information on some notable Marines:

Ten Actors Who Were Marines

<u>Don Adams</u> was born Donald James Yarmy in New York City and served with the United States Marine Corps during World War II in the Pacific Theater. He was wounded during the Battle of Guadalcanal and later contracted malaria, nearly dying of blackwater fever. Upon his recovery and return to the States, he served as a drill instructor.



Beatrice Arthur was born Bernice Frankel and became a medical technologist before World War II, when she volunteered for the U.S. Marine Corps, becoming one of its first female recruits.

<u>Drew Carey</u> joined the United States Marine Corps Reserve in 1980 and served for six years.

<u>Ronald Lee Ermey</u> spent two years as a drill instructor at Marine Corps Recruit Depot San Diego in San Diego, California, from 1965 to 1967. In 1968, in Vietnam, he served for 14 months with the Marine Wing Support Group 17. He then served two tours of duty in Okinawa, Japan, during which he rose to the rank of Staff Sergeant and was medically discharged in 1972 for several injuries incurred during his tours. Ermey was later honorary bestowed the rank of Gunnery Sergeant by the Marine Corps.

<u>Glenn Ford</u> volunteered for duty in World War II with the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve in 1942 and served as a photographic specialist. He also staged and broadcast the radio program Halls of Montezuma.

<u>Gene Hackman</u> served 3 years as a field radio operator in the U.S. Marine Corps.

<u>Robert James Keeshan</u> (Captain Kangaroo) joined the Marine Corps shortly before the end of WWII.

<u>Harvey Keitel</u> joined the United States Marine Corps at the age of sixteen and served in Lebanon.

<u>George C. Scott</u> joined the U.S. Marine Corps in 1945 and was assigned to the prestigious 8th and I Barracks in Washington, D.C. In that capacity, he served as a ceremonial guard at Arlington National Cemetery and taught English literature and radio speaking/writing at the Marine Corps Institute. He served until 1949. <u>James Whitmore</u> served in the United States Marine Corps during World War II.
