- Great way to motivate students
- *Fun way to review content
- Learn new key ideas
- * Helps teachers identify areas for remediation
- *Can be uploaded to teachers' website for student use
- * Allows teachers to review a great amount of content


- Learn content vocabulary words
- Stimulate critical thinking
- Enhances memory
- *Enables students to explain themselves clearly
- *Repetition enhances learning
- Can improve listening skills
- *Can enhance the classroom climate

- ★ Easy to create
- Middle school and elementary teachers can review several content area simultaneously
- *Foster teamwork and cooperation
- *Students are actively engage in the learning experience
- ★Students take risk
- * Students can submit questions for the game


❖ High school teachers can categorize their game board with key ideas from performance standard from each unit in the course.
